SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

5 Had enough? Yes, I know – they can be lame - but they make you think! Definitely, “The pun, also called paronomasia, is a form of word play that suggests two or more meanings, by exploiting multiple meanings of words, or of similar-sounding words, for an intended humorous or rhetorical effect” (Merriam-Webster Online Dictionary). Puns were found in ancient Egypt, where they were heavily used in development of myths and interpretation of dreams. In ancient Iraq, about 2500 BC, punning was used by scribes to represent words. The Mayans are known for having used puns in their hieroglyphic writing. Believe it or not, Jesus used word play in his teachings to both get people’s attention and to make them think. For example, in John 12:25, Jesus used two words virtually identical in their English translation, which lost the nuances of the original Greek. “*He that loveth his life (ζωὴν, pronounced zōēn) shall lose it; and he that hateth his life (ζωὴν again) in this world shall keep it unto life (ζωὴν, psuchēn) eternal.*” In Greek, though, the meaning might be closer to something like this: “*If you are obsessed with just your earthly, day-to-day living, you could lose out on the broad sweep of Life in you and all around you, even into Eternity.*” To me, God and the kingdom is to be found in the simple and mundane things of everyday life. If we focus only on ourselves and our wants and responsibilities, we can lose sight of the bigger picture - that’s how and where God is working – for, with, and through us. Therefore, I say, “**Love God and Love others.**”

As I sit here in the quiet of pre-dawn listening to the mesmerizing sounds of cardinals communicating with song across the skies, I praise God and am reminded of how often our God communicates with us through the hymns we sing. Take, for instance, the hymn "This Is My Song" which we sang July 6th in celebration of our Nation's birthday. God really got my attention when we came to the phrase "O hear my song, O God of all the nations, a song of peace for their land and for mine."

Another good example of God Moments, for not only did the hymn become a prayer, as was its writer's intent, but I added my own personal prayer for world peace. That prayer became even more intent July 17th when Israel was pressured into defending itself from Hamas aggression, and on that same day when an airliner carrying nearly 300 souls tragically fell victim to a missile while flying over Ukraine.

"Coincidentally," when I stopped into the Thrift Store July 11th for a friendly hello and hugs for Roger Harper and Sharon Williamson -- being sure to send hugs home to Shirley via Roger as well -- I noticed a stack of books on the counter. While I was looking through them, Sharon said Roger had brought them from home, and they were free, so I had her add two DAILY GUIDEPOSTS to my already-accumulated collection of treasures. A few days later when I picked up one of the Guideposts and randomly opened it, what did I find as the theme but "Praying the Hymns." Another God Moment, and all in God's timing because our Newsletter deadline was just around the corner for which I had not yet chosen a focus. "Praying the News" was my theme last month, and I believe "Praying the Hymns" is a perfect follow up.

Consider this a gentle reminder to all that not only do we sing hymns of our faith to make a joyful sound to God -- we also lift the WORDS of those hymns in prayerful praise and supplication to God in times of joy and celebration, and in times of sorrow or deep concerns. In other words, we need to allow the words of our hymns to register in our hearts and minds as we match them to the melody we are singing. And if this "distracts" you from singing by directing you to prayers from your heart, that's okay because it's a God Moment!

MISSION NOTES



Thanks to all who contributed to our Military Collection to benefit our local “Homeless Veterans Project” here in Volusia County (see article below). Your generosity to our veterans not only in this collection but the July “Food Basket Sunday” Collection is so appreciated by the residents at Haven Recovery.

Our August Mission project theme is “Going Back to School” and is twofold-local and international. Our local school initiative “Sneakers for Spruce Creek” will be a monetary collection to provide required Physical Education sneakers for families in need at neighboring Spruce Creek Elementary School. In working with the administration and counselors at the school, we have become aware of the great need that exist in our own neighborhood. Your response to the Angel Tree Project in December was overwhelming and so appreciated by those at Spruce Creek and we are excited to have the opportunity to again make a difference in a child’s life.



On the global scene, we are partnering with UCC Disaster Ministries and Church World Service to provide School Kits for distribution in Syria, the Sudan, Dominican Republic and other areas throughout the world. Our goal is to raise \$250 in gifts and in-kind donations which will aid us in purchasing, packaging and shipping the kits.

These kits will give children in impoverished schools, refugee camps, or other difficult settings some of the basic tools for learning. Thanks to Louise Eagan for making the bags.




