Just two days ago, the Dallas shootings occurred where five policemen were killed in the midst of what was, until that very moment, a peaceful demonstration against the unnecessary fatal shooting by a policeman of a citizen in Baton Rouge the prior week, and yet another in Minnesota. What comes next? Will this put our nation into spiraling episodes of similar violence? As if we didn't have enough to worry about! Let me share with you a timely quote regarding worry that I read this morning which was written by an author unknown.

"There are two days in every week about which we should not worry; two days which should be kept free from fear and apprehension. One of these days is YESTERDAY with all its mistakes and cares, its faults and blunders, its aches and pains. Yesterday has passed forever beyond our control. All the money in the world cannot bring back Yesterday. We cannot undo a single act we performed; we cannot erase a single word we said. Yesterday is gone forever. The other day we should not worry about is TOMORROW. With all its possible adversities, its burdens, its large promise and its poor performance, Tomorrow is also beyond our immediate control. Tomorrow's sun will rise, either in splendor or behind a mask of clouds, but it will rise. Until it does, we have no stake in Tomorrow, for it is yet to be born. This leaves only one day, TODAY. Any person can fight the battle of just one day. It is when you and I add the burdens of those two awful eternities Yesterday and Tomorrow that we break down. It is not the experience of today that drives a person mad. It is the remorse or bitterness of something which happened Yesterday and the dread of what Tomorrow may bring that renders a person wild with anxiety. Let us, therefore, live but one day at a time."

I would like to add the critical ingredient of Prayer, for it is through that gift from God that we release all feelings of fear and apprehension, anxiety and worry.

OPERATIONS TEAM


Even though the Operations Team will not meet formally again until September, projects around the church continue to move forward.




