Dear Friends,

Sue Batturs sent me this simple – yet powerful – story in an email:

A young couple moved into a new neighborhood. The next morning while they were eating breakfast, the young woman saw her neighbor hanging the wash outside. “That laundry is not very clean,” she said, “she doesn't know how to wash correctly. Perhaps she needs better laundry soap.” Her husband looked on, but remained silent.

Every time her neighbor would hang her wash to dry, the young woman would make the same comments. About a month later, the woman was surprised to see nice clean wash on the line and said to her husband, “Look, she has learned how to wash correctly. I wonder who taught her this.”

The husband said, “I got up early this morning and cleaned our windows.”

And so it is with life. What we see when watching others depends on the window through which we look.

Each of us has “windows” or filters through which we view the world, make decisions, and understand life. Churches have them as well. This month marks six months that we have been worshiping, serving, and having fellowship together. I am so thankful God has called Lisa and me here! During this time we have been getting to know one another and building a foundation of trust from which to move ahead and co-create with God a new future for our church. Inevitably, as we begin to do that, we shall have to look at the “windows” through which our church sees itself

and our world when making decisions about priorities and programs. Sometimes these “panes” may need to be “cleaned” in order to see more clearly the new ways we can live and serve as a portion of the body of Christ. God has a brighter future for us if we allow the Spirit to do a cleaning. We take our first step forward on November 20th (please see article of Upcoming Events on page 4 and save that date.) Please be in prayer as we consider more deeply who we are and where God may be calling us!


Pastoral Assistant *Beverly Schafer Accepted!*

SCHOOL SUPPLIES DRIVE: WOW!!! YOU DONATED



SO MANY WONDERFUL SCHOOL SUPPLIES!!

In addition to the many school supplies YOU donated we received 24 Backpacks, 17 pencil boxes and 2 Lunch Bags. These supplies all went to the Palm Terrace Elementary School; the same school that we connected with for our Angel Tree last year. We learned then that 90% of the children in that school are "Title One" students; children living at the Star Center (the center that is the location of the daily feeding program for the homeless) go to this school and there is a lot of "turnover" there as families come and go from living at that facility. **Carol McCarthy**, the volunteer Family Liaison who "works" at the school, helps the children and their families through donations when possible. She came to our Church to pick up the donations and as we were talking with her we found out that there are many day to day needs that the children have. For example many come to school with just flip flops on their feet. She told us that if we can find some "gently used" sneakers or shoes, she can use them. She also said socks and underwear are much needed so we went to our Thrift Store and Barbara Pountain gave her some children's shoes that hadn't been selling and Carol was overwhelmed with such a gift!

We already have the "Socks Box" and we are going to add another box for Children's Socks and Underwear. If you have any of these items that your children have outgrown and that still have some good wear in them, or if you see them on sale and wish to buy some, please bring them in and we will get them to the school. Everyone knows that times are difficult for many people and, if we can, we will help when we learn of a need.

STRENGTHEN THE CHURCH: We will be receiving the **Strengthen the Church** offering on the first Sunday in September (**September 4th**.) This donation goes toward helping New Church Starts and Renewing Existing Churches. Our Church has benefited from this offering twice; the first time when our Church was started and then several years later, when we wanted to change the Choir Loft so we could accommodate our Contemporary Worship Team. We received a \$5,000 Grant in order to do that. Now we have the opportunity to help other churches with our donations to this fund.

WE, your Missions Team, are always open to needs and hopefully we can count on your help in supporting the appeals that we share with you.

Please keep in mind OUR ONGOING ACTIVITIES: the **Food Basket** located by the front door of the sanctuary, the **Eyeglass Basket** located in the Jim Reed Bldg., where your old glasses get renewed for those who can't afford new ones, the white **Diaper and Formula Basket** in the back of the sanctuary for the Early Learning Coalition of Flagler and Volusia (a critical need as mothers must make a decision whether to buy these two items or food for their family) the **Campbells Labels for Education** where the receptacle is located in the Jim Reed Bldg., the **Pop Top Tabs** from soda and other cans that go toward the cost of cancer research. These are all examples of how YOU support these outreach projects which benefit the many people that we will never meet but who are God's children as we all are. Read further in this Newsletter to see how else you can help others with needs that we have recently been informed of.

As we enter into the Fall Season, there will be opportunities for us to share and be a part of a better world for our neighbors. Feel free to contact anyone on the Missions Team or Pastor Bill to share information about a need that you are aware of. We may not always be able to meet that need but we will certainly take it into consideration and get back to you.

REMEMBER THE MISSION BOXES. YOUR DONATIONS ARE VITAL TO THE MISSION WORK OF THIS CHURCH!! YOUR "CHANGE" ALONG WITH OTHER PEOPLES' CHANGE ADDS UP!!!! The boxes are located in the back of the sanctuary and by the outer door of the Jim Reed Building.

Meet Me in the Stairwell

You say you will never forget where you were when you heard the news on September 11, 2001.
Neither will I.

I was on the 110th floor in a smoke filled room with a man who called his wife to say, "Good-bye." I held his fingers steady as he dialed. I gave him the peace to say, "Honey, I'm not going to make it but it's OK . . . I'm ready to go."

I was with his wife when he called as she fed breakfast to their children. I held her up as she tried to understand his words and as she realized he wasn't coming home that night.

I was in the stairwell of the 23rd floor when a woman cried out to Me for help. "I have been knocking on the door of your heart for 50 years!" I said. "Of course I will show you the way home – only believe in Me now."

I was at the base of the building with the priest ministering to the injured and devastated souls. I took him home to tend to his flock in Heaven. He heard My voice and answered.

I was on all four of those planes, in every seat, with every prayer. I was in the very hearts of the believers there, comforting and assuring them that their faith has saved them.

I was in Texas, Virginia, California, Michigan, Afghanistan. I was standing next to you when you heard the terrible news. Did you sense Me?

I want you to know that I saw every face. I knew every name – though not all knew Me. Some met Me for the first time on the 86th floor.

Some sought Me with their last breath. Some couldn't hear Me calling to them through the smoke and flames; "Come to Me . . . This way . . . Take My hand." Some chose, for the final time, to ignore Me, but I was there.


I did not place you in the Tower that day. You may not know why, but I do. However, if you were there in that explosive moment in time, would you have reached for Me?

September 11, 2001 was not the end of the journey for you. But some day your journey will end. And I will be there for you as well. Seek Me now while I may be found. Then, at any moment, you know you are "ready to go."

I will be in the stairwell of your final moments.




Picture drawn and emailed the day after the 9/11 tragedy.



9/11 Remembrance Service

A Community Service of Remembrance, Respect, and Renewal will be held at the **Port Orange Amphitheater** on Sunday, **September 11th at 6:00 p.m.** The service will mark the 10th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks and hopes to bring our community together as a sign of unity in the midst of all types of diversity and the peace we all long for through healing that will instill hope in the hearts of people. This event is co-sponsored by the **Port Orange Ministerial Association** and the **Halifax Health-Hospice of Volusia/Flagler Counties**. POUCC's own Rev. Easy Key Lime Pie (Or Lemon Pie)



- 1 - pre-made crust; Short Bread, Nilla Wafer or Graham flavor (found in baking aisle)
- 1 – 14 oz. can sweetened condensed milk
- 2 large eggs (separate 1 egg)
- 1/2 Cup fresh lime juice (lemon juice can be substituted)
- 1/2 tsp. lime zest (lemon zest can be substituted)
- 1 – 8 oz. tub Cool Whip

Preheat oven to 350. Remove plastic liner from crust and save to use as lid. Brush crust with egg white and bake 5 minutes.

In medium bowl combine sweetened condensed milk, all eggs (including unused egg white from brushing the crust,) lime juice and zest. Pour into crust and bake 20 minutes. Remove from oven and cool to room temperature. Cover with plastic lid and refrigerate 2-3 hours. Spread entire container of Cool Whip over the top. Garnish with a slice of lime or lemon in the middle. Cover and keep refrigerated.

POUCC's Financial Picture


