OPERATIONS TEAM



Our Operations Team has been busy addressing issues around the property and listed below are the highlights of the March Meeting:

- 1. Veterans Chapel We are in the process of receiving bids for a walkway from the parking lot to the pavilion. Tracy Davis is preparing an estimate for construction of a grill and fire pit which will complete Phase One of this project. Thanks to Jack Barrick who is donating the slate for the fire pit.
- 2. Roof Repairs After receiving a number of bids from various roofers, it was decided to accept and forward to Council Shields Roofing quote of \$18,746 to replace the Sanctuary and Jim Reed roofs and gutters.
- 3. Janitorial Services As of March 28th, we have canceled our contract with Coverall. It was decided to hire a custodian to work 10 hours a week. Bob Gaither will conduct interviews.
- 4. POUCC Insurance Policy Renewal date for this is May 8th and due to costs and coverage concerns we are considering returning to our previous provider The Insurance Board of UCC. Sher Buller will meet with the agent to discuss our options.
- 5. Space Issues, Sunday School, Youth Group & Parking To help eliminate our space problems, the Team discussed the possibility of making some changes to current rooms. The topic of a storage unit or small building for our youth's weekly usage as well as their fundraising for this project was discussed. The issue of the limited parking on the West Property was discussed and signs will be ordered and placed (See article below).


