INTERIM PASTOR'S MESSAGE

John 9:25, "One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see."

What better description of the meaning of Easter, than what the blind man who had been healed by Jesus says to the religious community, "Once I was blind, but now I can see!" Easter is a time of "new beginnings!" It is a story of dying and overcoming death in a new form. Like the phoenix rising anew out of the ashes of its older self, we can find transformation of our life through the power of God.

How do we explain Easter to others? How do we explain an empty tomb? How do we explain a resurrected Savior? These are all mysteries; events that cannot be explained.

That's about Christ! How about what goes on in our personal lives? How do we explain a transformative experience in our life? Quoting from Anna Carter Florence, Professor of Theology, Columbia Seminary, "So let description of the before and after be the thing. Once I saw the world like this; now I see it like this. Once I believed this; now I believe this. Once I lived in a place that I now see was blind to certain things. Now my eyes are opened, and here is what I see and know!

Jesus has changed us. We cannot tell how or why, or offer any proof that will be convincing. All we can say is, "before Jesus, my life was like this; since Jesus, my life is like this!"

Confess Jesus; do not explain him. In the end, all we can say is that we believe

With each new dawn, we have the opportunity to see a new way, to experience life differently than the day before. We as a faith community are being challenged to join in a transformative time in the life of this church. We did the work of Cross-Roads, looking at who we are, what gifts we possess, and how we are going to reach out into the larger community. This is in a sense a part of the Lenten walk. We are at a critical point in our journey – that of staying committed to our future. Like the disciples hiding in a room, discussing "what do we do now", I would encourage the four workshop committees to gather and assess where we are in achieving our goals.

Finding our sight means nothing unless we are willing to take action. This action cannot be done by just a few, but must be unified by all joining hands and working together. Think about what might have happened had not all the disciples seen Jesus after his resurrection? It is only when we act upon our encounter, our new vision, that the transformation is complete and useful.

What will the Easter story hold for Port Orange United Church of Christ this year?

OPERATIONS TEAM

Your Operations Team met on March 13th and the following topics were discussed:

- All Church Manual: The Committee continues to work on this this project.
- Exterior Doors, Down Spouts and Jim Reed Room Building Leaks: Thanks to the gifts of time and resources by Billy and Peggy Wiggins ALL the exterior doors of the church have been painted, the roof leaks in the Jim Reed Building have been addressed, and a strategy for the ceiling repairs in the Jim Reed Building has been set in place. Painting of the Jim Reed Room will have to wait until ceiling is repaired.
- Kitchen Sink Grout & Valve on Gas Stove: Project to be addressed and completed in near future.
- **Secure Finance Area/Divide Room:** It was decided to construct a 8 foot room divider not a wall to allow return air flow for heat/air thus not requiring any permit from the city. Estimates for construction of the divider were obtained. Bob Brewster has made a generous offer to pay for the materials and Joey, Trey, and Van Thompson and Hal Francis have offered to help construct the wall.
- Chancel Railing: Estimates to install a single rail behind the Pastor's chair and along the organ has been obtained
- AT&T Cell Tower: Talks between AT&T and Tom Besaw continue.
- Easter Sunrise Service: Lt. Max Binz of the Ponce Inlet Police Department has agreed to provide a traffic detail to direct traffic and parking. Permission has been secured from the Volusia County Beach Safety Division to allow an officer to tow our equipment trailer from the entrance ramp to the beach at the North Turn Restaurant to the service site at Winter Haven Park, allow us to keep it there during the service and return it to beach entrance at the conclusion of the service.
- Parking Bumpers: Estimate will be obtained to repair the broken bumper.

Next Operations meeting scheduled for Monday, April 10, 2017 at 6:30 PM.

HAPPENINGS AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL UCC

UCC sends assistance to South Sudan and other African countries

The United Church of Christ is sending an initial \$85,000 in aid to South Sudan and three other African counties to help people combating a crisis fueled by war, severe drought and massive food shortages, with famine declared in some areas.

"Famine is not a word that is used lightly or that simply means a shortage of food. This crisis, this emergency demands our immediate attention and response," said Zach Wolgemuth, executive director, UCC Disaster Ministries. "The One Great Hour of Sharing funds that we've received from our generous donors allowed us to respond quickly and undoubtedly save lives." According to the United Nations, famine, which has been designated in parts of South Sudan, can be declared only when certain measures of mortality, malnutrition and hunger are present. At least 20 percent of households face extreme food shortages with a limited ability to cope; acute malnutrition rates exceed 30 percent; and the death rate exceeds two people a day among 10,000.

The UCC is responding to the crisis, along with other members of the global ecumenical community, coordinating their assistance through the ACT Alliance, which issued an appeal March 23 for nearly \$9.2 million. Partners will supply food, clean water, sanitation and hand washing equipment, non-food items, emergency health, protection and psychosocial support, seeds and tools.

BREAKFAST CASSEROLE RECIPES

We all have our favorite recipes and we welcome the variety. For those that need a recipe, may we suggest the following:



Sausage Hash Brown Breakfast Casserole

2 pounds hot pork sausage,
1 (30 ounces package frozen hash brown potatoes, thawed
2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese
3 teaspoons salt, divided
1 teaspoon ground black pepper
2 cups milk
6 large eggs, beaten

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease a 9 x 13 baking dish Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat. Cook and stir sausage in the hot skillet until browned and crumbly, 5-7 minutes; drain and discard grease. Stir hash browns, cooked sausage, Cheddar cheese, 1 teaspoon salt, and black pepper together in a large bow. Whisk milk, eggs, and remaining salt together in another bowl. Pour hash brown mixture into prepared baking dish, pour egg mixture evenly over hash brown mixture. Bake in preheated oven until bubbling and golden, about 45 minutes. Serves 10-12

Easy Cheese and Broccoli Breakfast Casserole

12 medium eggs
1/4 cup 2% milk
1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
1/2 teaspoon sea salt
1/2 teaspoon fresh ground black pepper
1 teaspoon minced garlic
1 teaspoon onion powder
12 oz. bag broccoli florets chopped and sautéed
1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese



Preheat oven to 325°F. Whisk eggs well, stir in all ingredients carefully until well combined. Pour ingredients into a 9 x 13 baking dish or a casserole dish coated with cooking spray. Bake for 40 minutes or until set. Cut and Serve warm. Serves 10-12.


