"A man is only as good as his word" - Mishneniwei

OPERATION AND FINANCE TEAM REPORT



We are happy to report that the underground water leak of about 40 gallons per hour or roughly almost 1,000 gallons a day...has been found. Roots from a nearby hedge planted some 40 years ago finally broke the main pipe coming from the water meter to the church wall. This leak was first detected in late January thanks to Port Orange's Water Hawk program that monitors water usage and sends out alerts through emails when it exceeds forecast. This leak was repaired on Friday 3/19. Our water usage immediately dropped to about 10 gallons per day. Not much else to report because church usage has been at a minimum and normal wear & tear has been almost non-existent. The Thrift Store remains our busiest use and it is holding

up well. Financially, we will be launching our "**Spring into Life**" campaign shortly into which funds can be donated and dedicated to maintaining our church property and buildings. Regarding other finances, we are doing OK thanks to some less than expected expenses and the continued generosity of everyone's giving including our Thrift Store that is continuing to out perform forecasted revenues. Our church grounds are also looking good for the coming hurricane season with much of the trees trimmed and pruned. Until next month, if you see anything requiring maintenance, fixing, replacing or out of place, please let us know by calling the church office.


