PASTOR'S MESSAGE



From the Pastor's Desk -

When you read this, Holy Week and Easter Sunday will be in our rearview mirror and we will be heading forward into spring.

This year during Lent, a small group has met weekly to discuss Christ and the Chocolaterie. We began this short

Bible study group by together viewing the 2000 Academy Award nominated film, *Chocolat* starring Juliette Binoche and Johnny Depp. The film was based on the 1999 bestselling novel, *Chocolat* by Joanne Harris.

The film is based in France and shares life in a small town stubbornly rooted in old traditions. When the mysterious Vianne and her child arrive in town in the winter of 1959, no one could have imagined the impact that she and her spirited daughter would have on the community. She opens an unusual chocolate shop, across the square from the church. She has the ability to perceive her customers' desires and satisfy them with just the right chocolate confection, and slowly coaxes the villagers to abandon themselves to temptation - - just as Lent begins. The film is about the villagers journey during this time of Lent and as they encounter some unwanted travelers.

The film allowed us to explore some provocative questions on the challenges of Christian living in our post modern world while taking a look at the popular act and challenge of "giving up" something for Lent, like chocolate.

Each week we focused on one of five themes: 1) giving up something as a prelude to change in our lives; 2) giving out to others and the power of that as a gift to both the giver and receiver; 3) the possibility of change in getting wise about the things we do; 4) the idea of getting real as a power of true acceptance of all God's children; and 5) growing up in the process of change and the power of learning no matter our age. 

OPERATION AND FINANCE TEAM REPORT



- The Thrift Store Annex: Proposal for \$21,950.40 from Tuff Shed has been reviewed and approved, the 20% deposit has been provided. The Sales agreement (contract) was presented incorrectly; we are awaiting the revised agreement for review and signature. The site plan has been approved; Tuff Shed is completing the engineering and permitting process with the City of Port Orange. The process will take 60-90 days for completion and installation.
- <u>Pastor's Office Floor:</u> A Weight Watchers worker offered and provided \$800.00 to purchase and install new LVT flooring in the Pastor's office. The

LVT has been purchased for +- \$390.00. AJP completed the project on Monday March 18, 2024.

- <u>Sanctuary Painting</u>: Premier painting provided a quote to provide all materials and paint the entire sanctuary walls and trim in the amount of \$5,450.00. The project is on a temporary hold to further discuss timing.
- <u>Thrift Store Painting:</u> Patching and painting of the Thrift Store walls is moving along. Three rooms have been painted, 3 remain. Replacement of the painted ceiling tiles in the furniture store has also commenced.
- <u>Andy:</u> Our newest member of the committee has been volunteering at the Thrift Store three days a week assisting Craig. He has quickly become a big help to the program.
- <u>Sod Replacement:</u> Dead sod in the courtyard will be removed and replaced with new sod. Peaceful Palms will complete the work.
- <u>Drainage Swale:</u> Hardy Construction of Lake Helen will "box out:" the rear grass parking exit (muddy area) place stone and dig a swale to the rear swale. Hardy will donate the work to the church.
- <u>Irrigation System:</u> Our irrigation system is operating properly, although it requires constant maintenance.
- <u>Lawn Maintenance</u>: We renewed the yearly lawn maintenance contract with the existing contractor March 1, 2024.
- FPL Site Light: We still have not been able to get FPL to respond to the inoperative site light.
- Overall Review: The new maintenance shop we commandeered in the HVAC room of the Thrift Store is working well. Many of the donations we have received over the past months have included useful tools and equipment to assist with the ongoing maintenance of our buildings and grounds.


