I like the thought and writings of Bishop John Shelby Spong. I do not always agree with him but I believe he usually points in good directions for the church to think and focus for the future. Recently, he wrote a response to a question printed in his weekly newsletter. I include an excerpt:

The certainties of yesterday are not viable today. Christianity is a journey into the future, the unknown, a journey beyond our familiar security patterns...Any church that does not confront the reality of this new world is not a church that will survive. To pretend that nothing has changed is a stance of disaster, but that is the stance in which most church life is lived today. It is not easy to be a Christian in the 21st century. It demands hard work, difficult thinking, the embracing of radical insecurity and the possession of a faith deep enough to know that God is real and to journey into the unknown in search of that reality.

"A New Christianity for a New World" (July 16, 2015) Frankly, we do live in changing and uncertain times. Not surprisingly but thankfully, the church is not immune from what is happening locally and globally. Churches are challenged in some ways as much or more today than ever before both internally and externally. Sadly, too many churches are focused on survival as an institution instead of doing mission and truly being the church Christ calls us to be. I am proud of our commitment to mission and celebrate with you what we have been able to do to help the needy both near and far. Still, we need to think and pray about what and where God needs us to be in the future. We need to be honest with ourselves in terms of what "business" we're in, who we're trying to serve, and how can we be faithful as the uncertain future unfolds. I will be leading a Study and Prayer Group in the Fall with Kay Russell. The focus will be on struggling with these questions in these exciting and anxious times. We will be utilizing a book called The Great Emergence: How Christianity is Changing and Why by Phyllis Tickle. You can get a used copy of the book on Amazon or the local library. Borrowing from the thought of Rev. Mark Dyer, Tickle supports his thesis that every 500 years the church goes through what he called a "Rummage Sale" wherein old ways dissolve and new ways of thinking, worshiping, and witness evolve. Both believe we are in the middle of such an event. That's why we feel anxious because we know we are changing but it does not yet appear what we may be. Let's get together and explore the book and what the premise and promise may be for us. I am looking for 8-10 members to covenant and join me. Will you be one of them? Let me know.

Major disappointments can do a real number on you if you let them. Combine that with a major concern, and you have a major struggle. That's what happened to Tim and me last month when we were less than ten minutes into our drive to Jacksonville's Mayo Clinic for his open-heart surgery. Through a brief phone call from the surgeon's office, we were told Tim's surgery would be postponed ten days. UNBELIEVABLE was the first word out of our mouths. It had taken us months to prepare emotionally for this surgery, and it took just a moment to rip that strength

right out of us. We were instantaneously emotionally deflated. Oddly enough, when his mitral valve surgery in 2012 was postponed as he was being rolled into the OR, we took it much better; but a SECOND time? Give me a break!

Sometimes it is very difficult to accept God's timing and, I have to admit, it was a "bit" sluggish in coming for me this time; but I am now comforted and assured that "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." (Ecclesiastes 3:1) As children of God, we are blessed with a "back-up battery" that sustains us when all else is depleted. When we're dazed and slow to hook into that power, it's there for whenever we are ready, for "He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless." (Isaiah 40:29)
