INTERIM PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Jonah 4: 4 But to Jonah this seemed very wrong, and he became angry.² He prayed to the LORD, "Isn't this what I said, LORD, when I was still at home? That is what I tried to forestall by fleeing to Tarshish. I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity.³ Now, LORD, take away my life, for it is better for me to die than to live."

The month of July was quite a month for your Interim Pastor. I spent a week in Baltimore attending the 31st Synod meeting of the UCC. It was a week of renewal for me as I was able to see old friends from around the country, as well as networking, making new friends and learning about various areas of concern that as a denomination we have. There were many uplifting sermons and worship gatherings. But what I took away from all of the hustle and bustle of such a gathering was the renewed awareness that we at Port Orange UCC are not alone, but we have a huge family that loves to get together and share God's love and serve God's call to mission. One of the messages in particular that struck me was the idea that the, "church needs to catch up with what God has already done." What is it that God has already done? God has called us to be a transformative people.

The second outstanding moment of July was our VBS that was held on Saturday the 23rd of July. I first would like to thank all of the people who were instrumental in making this happen. We had 6 young folks attend. The VBS worship Sunday was also very meaningful and spirit filling for me. It was such a joy to be able to discuss with these young people the theological meaning that we should be taking away from the book of Jonah. For the story of Jonah is filled with transformation! Jonah had the opportunity to see God working in his life. The biggest examples are: how God follows Jonah when Jonah was running away. The other was the protection God provided to Jonah in the belly of the big fish. Transformation came to the people of Nineveh, as they responded to the message from God, through Jonah, and were spared harm and were given forgiveness and mercy. The final act of the story was Jonah being angry with God for showing mercy to the Ninevites, and at the end of the book, remained mad at God for His mercy toward people that Jonah felt should be shown no mercy.

We see at the end of the book, Jonah even when blessed and protected by God, Jonah never experienced transformative living in his heart.

What I am about to bring forth as an observation as your Intentional Interim Pastor is crucial as the actual search for your next settled pastor has now begun. During my time with you, I have spoken much on the desire of God for Her people to live into transformative living. I see heads shaking in agreement when I am speaking about this from the pulpit. Yet, when grumblings from members of this faith family that reflect more of a Jonah than of Jesus. I realize that we as a community of faith have a long way to go in being a congregation that believes in transformative living. As the speaker at the Synod meeting says, "the church needs to catch up with what God has already done." Speaking as your interim pastor, when comments that boil down to, "I will leave the church if...." I have to ask myself, "where does this attitude come from?" Is it from a lack of knowledge and understanding of God's word or does it come from self-righteous attitudes. Jonah was plagued by self-righteous attitude and was mad at God for not being the God Jonah wanted God to be. It is my responsibility as interim pastor to point out to you, my brothers and sisters in Christ, that statements made as "threats" do not provide an atmosphere for open and honest discussion about issues that as a congregation need to be discussed collectively. "Threats" are nothing more than a Jonah attitude. I am sure this will be making some of you very upset and if it has, then ask yourself "Why." "What is it about allowing God in my life in a way that challenges my preconceived ideas of justice and mercy, grace and acceptance that upsets me so?"


Transformative living is being open to hearing God's call for mercy and justice, of examining our hearts by the words of Jesus, and seeing where we need to make personal and congregational adjustments, of tearing down boundaries. Transformative living requires not only a change of heart within us, but requires us to be actively working in the world to create what Jesus refers to as "the kingdom of God, here on earth." The study of the Beatitudes has been an exercise in trying to understand what God's kingdom looks like. We at Port Orange UCC do many wonderful things but as the call at Synod says, "we as the church need to catch up with what God has already done."


