PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Thought for the Month: Now we see things imperfectly as in a poor mirror but then we will see everything with perfect clarity. 1 Corinthians 13:12

From the Pastor's Desk:

We certainly are in the midst of a Florida summer right now. The heat, humidity, and thunderstorms remind us daily of where we live. Hopefully, your air conditioning keeps working to keep you comfortable.

A few days ago, I read something that had me thinking of my family's annual summer trip to a nearby amusement park. Did you ever go into a Fun House at an amusement park or fair? When I was a child once a summer, we would go to Lincoln Park in a nearby town. It was a local amusement park that had a Fun House with dark hallways you had to walk through. I loved knowing we were

near the end of the walk when we came to a room that had mirrors on each side. They were what you would call "magic mirrors" with concave and convex surfaces that portrayed our images as anything but normal.

The images would be contorted – sometimes short and stubby and others long and pencil-thin. As children, we would giggle as we twisted and turned, stretched and squatted in front of the mirrors. Our imperfect reflections really amused us.

Scripture says that, in life, we see our circumstances imperfectly as in a poor mirror. That reflection rarely evokes laughter and delight. It often appears unfair, harsh, or painful.

I experienced this when my grandmother died a while back. I was in Toronto at a conference and couldn't get back in time for her memorial service. I felt alone, disconnected from my family during the days following her death. I wondered why God, in all God's sovereignty allowed this timing. I even struggled with feeling as though serving God required too great a sacrifice.

A number of years have passed since that experience, and I still don't see God's purposes clearly. But I know this – someday Jesus will set it right. "We'll see it all then, see it all as clearly as God sees us, knowing him directly just as he knows us! (1 Corinthians 13:12 The Message).

Enjoy this summer season and may we all pray over the next few months that "hurricane season" in Florida looks kindly on us and passes us by without a storm.

This can be very frustrating for some. I would like everyone to try something. Using Pastor Pat's request of us on Sundays as an example, let us all try to do it a few more times during the week, perhaps once a day or even several times a day. I think the results could be very enlightening. Maybe even spiritually healing. What if in that brief but powerful moment of relaxing and taking a deep breath with our eyes closed, we also reinforce God's presence in each of our individual lives? What could that do? 
