SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Advent and Christmas seasons greetings everyone,

I'm still finding it interesting to deal with the beautiful weather all around us and remembering it's the middle of November. I need to keep reminding myself of the upcoming seasons of Advent and Christmas. They are coming fast! You know what else is coming? Christ is coming again!

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you. I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am. You

This is the time of year when we should slow down and take stock in ourselves looking forward to Christ coming again. The season of Advent is a time to prepare for the second coming of Christ. Yes, in December we will be celebrating two church seasons. Advent begins on Sunday, December 2 and continues until sundown on Christmas Eve. During this season take some time to look at your life and pray you are prepared for the second coming of our Lord and Savior.

As the Advent season moves along, we also should be preparing for the celebration of the anniversary of the birth of Christ. The season of Christmas begins at sundown on Christmas Eve and continues until January 6 when the season of Epiphany begins. Yes, there are twelve days in the season of Christmas. Somehow so many people seem to believe they begin on December 13.

The season of Christmas doesn't end when the torn wrapping paper is thrown away and the turkey and ham leftovers are placed in the refrigerator. Please remember to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ throughout the entire Christmas season. Since almost all the radio stations end their Christmas music on Christmas day, please have a good selection of Christmas music recorded on your smart phones to listen to until January 6.

During this month of transition from autumn to winter we also transition from preparing for the second coming and the birth of Christ, to celebrating his birth. What a most wonderful time of the year.

These normal expenses did put us in the red, however, because our income continues to be less than we need to have a balanced budget. **The Operating account has run out of money.** We are continuing to use the benevolent/emergency fund to pay some of the church's expenses through the end of the year. DEACON'S CORNER



As we start our entry into the Christmas Season, we bring our focus on the needs of others. There are several ways that we can help by offering and/or communicating the names of those in need of prayer support.

FROM THE DEACONS

POUCC Impressions, our monthly newsletter, provides a listing of prayer requests. This listing covers the person's name and their connection to our Church. Anyone may place a name on this list. As a courtesy to those you ask to be put on the list, it would be nice to mention to that person of your intention, so they may have the opportunity to express their desire for privacy. Please notify the Church office if you want to place a name or names on the prayer request list. If you placed a name on the list or you know of a change in the status of another mentioned person, please let the office know when the person no longer needs to be on the list.

Sunday Worship Bulletin provides a weekly update of the prayer requests. It follows the same guidelines as the newsletter. Just a reminder to keep the list current.

Sunday Worship Services provide opportunities during prayer times for individual members to speak the names of people that are in need of our prayers.

Prayer Chain is a small group of dedicated members who, upon request, offer daily prayers for individuals. Currently there is a need to expand the number of members on the prayer chain. Due to how this small committee works, requests are taken separately from other prayer requests.

Prayer Request Box is located in the island outside the front door to the Church. It was started several years ago. Its purpose was to provide anyone the opportunity to drive by and drop off the names of people in need of prayers. It received good coverage in the local newspaper and we were blessed we could reach out in prayer for some non- church members in need. Unfortunately, the use of the box has diminished and the program is currently being re-examined. *Charlie Baskin, Chair of Deacons*

The Sanctuary mural is especially of concern since it is on a drywall base and subject to fading, cracking, moisture damage and general aging. 
