PASTOR'S MESSAGE From the Pastor's Desk –



As this newsletter reaches you, November and Thanksgiving will be in our rearview mirror as we speed down the highway towards the hustle and bustle of the Christmas/New Year season. It also brings us into one of the two most holy seasons in the Christian calendar. As you make preparations

for your family's holiday traditions, I urge you to take time to reflect on the real meaning of the season. When I personally get that rushed and hurried feeling during this time of year, I try to stop and think about what is truly important. For me, it's taking time to let folks know how much I care by sharing the power of God's love in any way I can. OPERATION'S & FINANCE TEAM

As I seem to start every article, welcome to the Holiday Season, Christmas, New Year's cooler, dryer weather is on its way. The following is Operation's Update:

APS Security Cameras: The dumpster camera has been adjusted to see the dumpster better, Bob and Emily have their phones connected to Total Connect so they can watch a live feed at any time on the eight cameras with their smart phone.



Site Lighting: Additional LED 35 watt site lighting was installed on the back of the thrift store to enhance the visibility of the dumpster area.

FPL monthly bill: Our demand charge has enhanced to a point where last months bill was over \$600.00; I have been in contact with FLP and they are investigating the reason. It appears FPL changed our rate without our knowledge. The energy audit was conducted on Monday November 6, 2023, FPL is reviewing all our recent monthly invoices and will adjust as necessary. FPL agrees our demand spike should not have happened. We will see the results in the next few months.

FPL Energy Audit Input: Many of the normal recommendations the report makes have been completed prior to the audit. Replacing the fluorescent lighting with LED, installing LED exterior site lighting, installing programmable thermostats, operating the large loads, (irrigation pump and sanctuary HVAC system) on off peak times, operating the other HVAC loads on off peak as much as possible. The report recommended the following:

Lighting: Consider installing motion sensors. Timers or photo cells to control lighting. We have installed motion sensors in the Reed bathrooms. Site lighting is presently controlled by either a time clock or photo cells.

Cooling-A/C: Try setting the temperature at 75+ degrees during occupied hours.

We have installed set back thermostats on all HVAC units, thrift store is set at 76F during occupied hours and 90F during off occupied hours. Reed is set at 76F during occupied hours and 90F during non-occupied times. Sanctuary 16 ton unit is operated off peak on Sundays and twice a week in the middle of the night (off peak) for humidity control.

Water Heating:

Sanctuary bathrooms do not have a water heater.

Reed bathrooms have a water heater but it is turned off.

Kitchen has time clock operation and only operates during off peak periods.

So, as you can see, we have completed most if not all the items on the report prior to the audit. We will continue to monitor the usage and adjust as necessary to keep the energy bill as low as possible.

Phase 2, French Drains: Peaceful Palms cleaned out the last under sidewalk drain and reconnected the leader to the drain. They installed a French drain and connected two of the downspouts to the drain. New sod was placed. This should eliminate the standing water during and after rain in the area of the thrift store entrance.

Irrigation System: is operational and all heads were checked, repaired and/or replaced as necessary. Irrigation heads that were in non-necessary areas were capped off. Monthly inspection and maintenance will be necessary.

Sanctuary Bathrooms: Four new HC toilets, four sink faucets have been purchased, Shaffer Plumbing will be providing and installing a new urinal valve (same as in the Reed bathroom) and installing the toilets and sinks, work should be completed by the end of November.

Sanctuary Hallway & Bathrooms: Premier painting (same folks that painted our exterior two years ago) will be repairing the ceilings, painting the ceilings and walls in the hallway, the men's, ladies' bathrooms and replacing all the pitted hardware in both bathrooms commencing on November 20, 2023.

Thrift Store Pavers: NSB Pavers has removed the existing sod at the end of the thrift store and installed pavers. We realized with the traffic it was impossible to maintain sod in this area, further thrift store clients use this are to move from the parking lot to the thrift store. NSB again donated a portion of the cost to the church.

Office Furniture: We are fortunate Bob Brewster's office was eliminating some of their office furniture and donated it to the thrift store. We placed two desks and 3 chairs in the back office for our tenant, he is extremely happy, the ladies also placed a painting on the wall for him. All office spaces now have matching chairs.

New pending jobs:

Church Office sign at the Reed room entrance.

Emergency light installation in the corridor outside the sanctuary bathrooms as well as on the old kitchen side of the wall.

Irrigation maintenance contract.

Removal of the dead shrubs and trees and installation of new shrubs in the island outside the sanctuary main entrance. *Art Horton, Chairman*






