#### SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Friends,

A friend of mine posted recently on Facebook, "I'd gladly trade Valentine's Day for a second Halloween." Obviously Beyond Measure Valentine's Day and the sentiments expressed by Hallmark

and the idealists and marketers of our world have not won him over. Anybody that knows me knows I love Halloween but what is it about love that is so painful? What is love anyway? We throw the word around casually and with all sorts of references on many different levels. Last week when we were driving through Bushnell on the way back from the service for Helen McGuffie at Florida National Cemetery, I saw a billboard that read, "James Barbeque: You'll Love It...And You Don't Need Teeth To Eat It!" Okay, I love Barbeque as well. Still, as people of God and disciples of Jesus, what is real love? Why is it so difficult to find it? I think in part, we struggle to find and express love because we get in the way of ourselves. We are a self-centered creature – much of that is natural and necessary for survival and achievements. I find myself struggling at times because my frame of reference needs to start with others more frequently. As a pastor and leader, I have discovered the need to make room for other people, their agendas, and needs. True, I must (as we all do) need to maintain appropriate boundaries and standards. Sadly, there are those who take advantage of others and abuse the goodness of others. There always have been those who understand love as subservience to their wants and demands. Think of how people tried to twist Jesus into what they wanted or what they wanted him to be. These next few weeks we will be looking closely at Jesus' life, ministry and death as our Lenten season begins to cast a shadow upon us. Love is never easy. We have all been wounded by it and wounded others through it. As a result, we can become cynical and untrusting of others. We can judge others to keep them at a distance and "stay safe." Mother Teresa once said some good things for us to remember this month:

"If you judge people, you have no time to love them."

"I am not sure exactly what heaven will be like, but I know that when we die and it comes time for God to judge us, he will not ask, 'How many good things have you done in your life?' rather he will ask, 'How much love did you put into what you did?"

Here's to the ideal and practice of real love. We will never be truly good at it or experience/express it consistently in this life but we can try. After all, we have been claimed by an immeasurable love and are challenged to go and do likewise. That's why we need a holiday (or holy day) to remember.


