Our expenses were \$18,931 more than our income for 2014. We did cash in a CD for \$14,800, to help pay for the roof replacement which, if figured in, would still leave us with a \$4,131 deficit. We had several unexpected expenses such as the roof and two air conditioner replacements for the year. Were it not for the generosity of members who made bequests to the Church, we would not have been able to pay for these unbudgeted items. Please consider including our Church in your Wills to insure our Church's future.

I am looking forward to a more uneventful year in 2015. Thanks everyone for your continued support.

Your Operations Team met on January 12th and the following is a summary of what was discussed at the meeting.

Susie Greiff presented the Treasurer's Report. The 2014 P&L ended with a \$4,100 deficit - Susie will put a summary together to add to the Annual Report explaining why we had this deficit.

Old Business:

- Winsemius Bequest The home has sold. The church will be receiving 10% of this sale after the closing. The family has requested the gift to go to needed kitchen upgrades and renovations.
- Spiritual Life Retreat on 1/24/2015 went well. We had 24 attendees at the workshop.
- 2015 Stewardship Campaign The congregation has been informed and we have received 32 pledges totaling \$62,778.
- Parking Lot Repair & Repaving Will be completed when weather permits.
- Website/PayPal No new information at this time.
- Tree Removal on West Property The tree has been removed. A replacement must be planted by 6/15 and Rich Thole will talk to Blaine about what might be the best choice of tree to replant.

New Business:

- New Faucet Men's Sanctuary Bathroom Has been replaced by Dalen Mills.
- Toilet Repair in Ladies Bathroom Jim Reed Room The flapper has been replaced by Dalen Mills.
- Scheduled Spring Workday to be Saturday, April 18th.
- Sanctuary Dimmers All switches need to be either replaced or labeled correctly. Dalen Mills to contact Billy Wiggins or Joey (Economy Electric) for a quote.
- Use of Parking Lot for Special Olympics Committee decided to continue to let them use it from 1 to 3 PM on Saturdays with Liability Insurance verification.
- Easter Sunrise 2015 Beach Permit application and Insurance Certificate have been submitted.
- Prayer Garden The new bricks have arrived. The garden will need to be weeded, and sand added.


