#### DEACON'S CORNER

Lent is fast approaching. Lent is a 40 day period of time (not counting Sundays) before Easter that represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and was tempted. As the date of Easter is calculated on the cycles of the moon, the date of Ash Wednesday will vary year to year. Ash Wednesday, February 26 is the beginning of Lent this year.



Our Church will hold a special Ash Wednesday service, starting at 5:00 pm.

Ash Wednesday starts Lent by focusing the Christian heart on prayer and repentance from sin. We can enter into the Lenten season solemnly, while also looking forward in greater anticipation and joy of the message of Easter and Christ's ultimate victory over sin and death.

Ash Wednesday is celebrated different ways from congregation to congregation. Some churches utilize the ashes prepared by burning the palm ashes from the previous year's Palm Sunday. The pastor or priest may invite those present to receive ashes on their foreheads. This follows the long tradition of churchgoers being marked on the forehead with a cross of ashes to symbolize the death and regret for past sins.

Ash Wednesday also leads into the start of Lent where many Christians fast in one form or another. Some follow the true meaning of fasting. Others do things like giving up chocolate. It's a matter of degrees.

Inside and outside we are now looking at all areas. In addition, we are also continuing deep reviews of all church



expenses for recommendations to be more cost effective without reducing what needs to be there for our church to accomplish its various missions. The recent Annual Meeting approved a deficit budget and provides us with a real challenge for what we can do and what we must do going forward. The generosity shown and demonstrated last year for our church was amazing and we hope that that it will continue. Having stated that, we are announcing a **NEW MATCHING FUNDS CAMPAIGN for Operations.** We just learned that our church irrigation system - pump and drop pipe to the well needs replacing. Some of you may have noticed that the water pressure is very low and the system is only spitting out water. This system is needed to keep our church grounds from browning and shrubs from dying. Like the last campaign we are seeking a donor(s) who will seed the matching portion. Our last campaign started with \$5K and it raised over \$13K total. These funds were both wisely invested and greatly improved the looks of our church. Can we do this again? #### RECIPE CORNER

## MOLLY BASKIN'S SUMMER SQUASH CASSEROLE

2 lbs. zucchini or yellow squash, about 6 cups sliced
1/4 to 1 cup chopped onions
Salt (optional)
1 can (10.75 oz.) condensed cream of broccoli cheese soup
1 cup sour cream

1 cup shredded carrots
1 cup Italian seasoned bread crumbs
1/2 (1 stick) melted butter

Heat over to 350. Combine squash and onions in large saucepan. Cover with water. Season with salt, if desired. Cook 5-8 minutes. Drain. Combine soup and sour cream in large bowl. Stir in carrots. Fold in squash and onions. Combine bread crumbs and butter. Spread half into bottom of 13x9x2 baking dish. Spoon in vegetable mixture. Sprinkle with remaining bread crumbs.

Bake at 350 for 30 minutes or until heated thoroughly. Serves 8.


