Thought for the Month *Love Lasts*.

From the Pastor's Desk: I was watching a woman the other day at the dentist's office. She was playing the game called "Peekaboo" with her baby. As I watched, she'd say, "Where's Mommy?" and hide her face behind her hands.

Then she would pull her hands away, saying, "Peekaboo, I

see you," and the baby would laugh.

From the baby's point of view, when she hid her face, the woman vanished — out of sight, out of mind. Or so I used to believe. As it turns out babies are smarter than we thought. According to an article in the Atlantic Monthly a while back, babies understand that objects, or people, persist over time even if hidden. Show an object to a baby. Hide the object behind a screen. Wait a while. Remove the screen. If the object is missing, the baby will act surprised. I can imagine the baby's surprise if the mother wasn't there when she removed her hands while playing peekaboo.

My point is that we all appreciate that, even when we can't see those we love, when their faces are hidden from us or they are far away, our love for them persists. God has designed the human heart to love even when we can't see or be with the ones we love. Inside our hearts, they persist; in our hearts, we feel they are there.

The same is true for God's love for us. During this month of February when we tend to think of love and celebrate love on February 14th, a special day called "Valentine's Day" Let us remember that God is always with us and God's love is never ending. That is the one promise God has made that we can always count on. We will never be alone, God will always be with us. God's love is there for us even when we can't feel it

LENTEN STUDY

Films can be great starting points for exploring profound issues about God, the world, and what it means to be human. With this study, we will view the 2000 Academy Award nominated film Chocolat, and use it to approach the season of lent by gaining insights into self-discipline, selfgiving, conversion, acceptance, and

maturing in Christ. We will use the movie and a short weekly reading to discuss topics of scripture, social awareness, service, community, prayer, integrity, love and what it means to be a follower of Christ. The study will take 6-7 sessions. A simple soup supper will be provided for attendees. Each session will be approximately 1 1/2 - 2 hours each. We will view the whole movie at the first session. Pastor Pat will lead the sessions.

OPERATION'S & FINANCE TEAM

For safety and ease of operation, we have decided to remove the sod area at the Thrift Store front area and add +- 3 feet of pavers. Work should be completed by the time you read this article. Received a quote from NSB Pavers (the same crew that reworded the prayer walkway last year), they again gave us a \$600.00 discount.



The Reed room roof has been recently cleaned, the mold removed and all the concrete sidewalks pressure washed. We are requesting quotes to remove the carpet in the Jim Reed room and replace with LVT (luxury vinyl tile).

The renovation work in the Thrift Store office and adjoining sales rooms is moving forward. A permanent wall and shelves between the office and sales rooms has been installed, new shelving installed in the TS office, walls in all three rooms will be patched and painted.

The Council approved moving forth with painting the sanctuary walls and work should commence very soon.

New door signs have been ordered and installed on the Thrift Store and Reed Building doors.

The Council approved moving forth with the Thrift Store storage building. The plan is to commence in two phases, first to pour the foundation and floor, second phase is to install the building. We would appreciate any and all donations for this project. Our Thrift Store is doing phenomenal business every day therefore we need the storage building as soon as possible.

The kitchen is being used more and more as it was designed (to prepare and cook food). Alan Holcomb has stepped up to be our master chef. The recent thank you breakfast for the Thrift Store volunteers was a rousing success, but it made us aware for the kitchen to function as it was designed, a few improvements were necessary Commercial knives, a hanging pot and pan rack were purchased, the rack was installed so Alan can have ready access to whatever he needs to make the kitchen work well.

Now that the unpaved parking area is being used on a regular basis for Weight Watchers as well as Thrift Store clients a muddy area has become evident at the rear exit/entrance at the juncture of the pavement and sod. Quotes are being sought to install a catch basin and drain piping to the swale.

Our church exterior is in great shape and with all your continued support we will continue to work on projects that enhance our "curb appeal" as well as our missions.

I personally see the growth and enthusiasm in our church members and the area we serve outside the church every day at the Thrift Store. Until we see each other again, God bless. *Art Horton. Chairman*


