SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Pastor's Message

"Behold, I am doing a new thing." *Isaiah 43:19* Dear Friends.

As we stand on the threshold of a new year, it is naturally a time to pause, reflect, look backward, and forward as well. What will our lives be in 2015? What changes will come – will they be welcome or unwelcome? For our church, what changes will come? Where will God be leading us? This is an exciting time to

be in the church – and a challenging one. Many churches are undergoing a huge change in the relationship between themselves and our culture. The mainline church as we have known it is dying. That is not a bad thing but a promising reformation. These cycles happen roughly about every 500 years according to sociologist Phyllis Tickle - who wrote the book *The Great Emergence* in 2008 – when the Church goes through an upheaval or great shift (what Anglican Bishop Mark Dyer calls a "rummage sale"). Basically new forms of life and witness are born. Historically, these shifts happened in the explosion of monasticism under Pope Gregory the Great in the 5th century, the Great Schism of the church into Eastern and Western branches in the 11th century, the Protestant Reformation in the 16th century, and now the Postmodern era in the 21st century have all been points of reference for these changes. What is giving way right now is mainline Protestantism, in the form that we have known it, and what is emerging is a new form of Christianity - what she calls "The Emergent Church." According to her, "people are looking for a new and different encounter with God. The strength of Protestantism was its rationalism—it took religion to the head. But today people want religion that also touches their hearts. It's not anti-intellectual; mind and reason are still very important. But people want more than just an intellectual challenge. They want something that moves them emotionally, as well. It is bringing the heart and the head together." (Interview in Vancouver Sun, December 2010). For her, this means (among other things) that the church will change, adapt, and move forward by reaching back into the rich history, tradition, and worship life of the very early church. We need to ponder and consider her words carefully as we move forward as a congregation into 2015. No doubt, we will need to make changes in our life and mission in the years to come. God is doing a new thing in our midst. Are we a part of it? Are we helping people find Christ? Do our ministries and missions help reach people's hearts? I thank you for your commitment to continue to struggle with and strive for these goals as we venture into this New Year. May God bless us all! PASTON BU

Much like the widow in scripture who gave all that she had, only two coins, last month a homeless man in London with the equivalent of a total of only \$4.60 in change in his pocket gave a university student all his money to help her pay for a taxi in her time of need. Overwhelmed by this kind act of generosity, the student has since raised almost \$50,000 for the Good Samaritan and for other homeless individuals in her community.

Also last month, police officers somewhere in Michigan, after pulling over drivers for minor traffic violations, would engage the driver in conversation which led to questions zeroing in on what the driver wanted for Christmas but simply could not afford. Through pre-arranged logistics, a team of fellow officers who were "staked out" in a large wholesale store would bolt through the isles, find the item desired and hurriedly wrap it on their way to their companion officer and the individual who was pulled over. The officer in charge would then retrieve the gift from his buddies who had pulled up behind him, and presented it to the unsuspecting driver. We're not talking low-dollar items, either. Usually it was a gift for their children like a bicycle, or one the entire family would enjoy such as a TV. Tears of joy was the norm! BTW, their traffic violation penalty was written off as well.

Combine these stories with numerous others, such as an anonymous individual paying off all the layaway gifts in a Wal-Mart store in New Jersey, or our very own Thrift Store giving items free of charge to families in dire need, as well as our Angel Tree and several additional ministries throughout the year, and you realize there just may be hope for the human race after all! In this time of horrific news throughout the world and within our own country, let us all endeavor to change God's tears of sorrow into tears of joy as we begin a new chapter of life in this new year as his beloved children here on earth. Multiplying God's love by paying it forward in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is a beautiful example of how we can achieve this -- not only for the obvious act of love and generosity, but also because it's contagious! Now, that makes ME smile, too!


