SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Friends,

As we enter a New Year, there will be the inevitable myriad of resolutions and promises to take up something new and hopefully change our lives as a result. There will be plenty of ads for us to spend our money to help us accomplish those changes as well. While some of those

promises to change might be quite noble and even beneficial, I'd like to suggest we avoid possibly setting ourselves up and propose letting something go instead. And there's no financial cost to it and the payoff is immeasurable. George Eliot was the pen name of English novelist Mary Anne Evans. She has a telling phrase in one of her books: "It's but little good you do, watering last year's crop." Think of a farmer who's survived a devastating year of drought. The fields are filled with dried-up, stunted stubble of last year's corn. If the farmer were to go out and irrigate that land, in hopes of making that which is dead grow again, it would be lunacy. Yet isn't that what many of us do in our lives? We are burdened with regrets, missed opportunities, perhaps even grievous errors. Farmers know it is better, by far, to write off last year's "crop" - to plow it under, to sow the furrows afresh for the season ahead. What about each of us? We need to let go of the past. Yes, remembering is an important part of our learning and identity but I'm referring to being captured emotionally and spiritually by it – either as a glorification or an indelible marker of failure. We simply cannot move forward as long as we are clinging to the past. We cannot change it. To hold on only robs us of what joy and abundance we can possibly hope to find in our tomorrows. There comes a time for letting go, for turning it over to the Lord, and for trusting in God's mercy and faithfulness to both forgive and bless us in spite of who we are and how last year's "crop" fared. 
