DEACON'S CORNER

Our Church has had to dip into its Benevolent Fund to help pay current expenses. It is important for everyone to know about the Fund's purpose and how it operates.



FROM THE DEACONS

The purpose of this Fund is to enhance the mission and outreach of the Port Orange United Church of Christ. Both the income and principal, under certain restrictions, may be used. The Operations Team shall make decisions supporting the concept that the Fund is for long-term purpose versus short-term immediacy.

The Church's Operation Team acts as Custodians of the Fund. The Operations Team may establish a committee of not more than three Church members to advise on the management of the Benevolent Fund. The Operations Team is responsible for reporting to the Church Council on the Fund on at least a quarterly basis and to the congregation at its annual meeting.

Donations to the Benevolent Fund come from memorial donations in remembrance of deceased persons and honoring certain people for their service to God and Church. The Funding may come to the Benevolent Fund through bequests in will, charitable remainder trusts, charitable gift annuities, assignment of life insurance and/or transfer of property (cash, stocks, bonds real estate, etc.)

The distribution of the funds is somewhat restricted to protect our Church and the Fund. A yearly draw of 4% may be taken each year. The Church Council, by action requiring a ³/₄ vote, may withdraw additional funds. No more than 50% of the Funds assets may be withdrawn within a 12 month period by this type of action. Withdrawing greater than 50% of the Funds assets within a 12 month period requires a 3/4 vote of the Church Council and a majority vote of the congregation. While the Fund is to be used for long-term management of the Church and its mission, the use of this Fund for current spending may be justified.

Currently within our Benevolent Fund are donations memorializing many members that are deceased. A very large donation has been placed in the Fund through a bequest in a will. I understand others within our Church life have placed a bequest to our Church in their wills. It is a well thought out "thank you". *Charlie Baskin, Chair of Deacons*


