SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Merry Christmas and a Blessed New Year,
Well, here we are at the beginning of

Well, here we are at the beginning of a new calendar year. Most of us believe the holidays are over and well behind us but the truth is (if you are reading this prior to January 6) we are still officially in the Christmas season.

Most of us feel relieved knowing all of the hubbub and scurrying around has subsided and the retailers have backed off

from their mammoth advertisement campaigns but take some time to continue celebrating the birth of our Lord and Savior.

The season of Epiphany begins on Monday, January 6 and continues until the beginning of the season of Lent, Ash Wednesday, February 26.

The term **epiphany** means "to show" or "to make known" or even "to reveal." It remembers the coming of the wise men bringing gifts to visit the Christ child, who by doing so "reveal" Jesus to the world as Lord and King.

As with most aspects of the Christian liturgical calendar, Epiphany has theological significance as a teaching tool in the church. The Wise Men or Magi who brought gifts to the infant Jesus were the first Gentiles to acknowledge Jesus as "King" and so were the first to "show" or "reveal" Jesus to a wider world as the incarnate Christ. This act of worship by the Magi, which corresponded to Simeon's blessing that this child Jesus would be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles" (Luke 2:32), was one of the first indications Jesus came for all people, of all nations, of all races, and the work of God in the world would not be limited to only a few.

The Epiphany season is now observed as a time of focusing on the mission of the church in reaching others by "showing" Jesus as the Savior of all people. It is also a time of focusing on Christian brotherhood and fellowship, especially in healing the divisions of prejudice and bigotry that we all too often create between God's children.

Our Missions' Committee is working to help others here in the Port Orange area and elsewhere. This is a wonderful time of the year to become a part of the missions work done at Port Orange UCC and/or financially support the work of those able to share their time and abilities to those less fortunate. Joyfully and lovingly working together,

MODERATOR'S MESSAGE


Greetings and welcome to January,

OPERATIONS TEAM



Your POUCC Operations Team (Bob Brewster, Art Horton & Trey Thompson) want to thank everyone who contributed to our Operations Matching Funds Campaign. The monies raised so far exceed \$12,500 and even though the official matching funds campaign stops on December 31, we hope that the giving will continue. All funds raised are being used 100% for maintaining the church property – inside and outside. The results of this investment can be easily seen when viewing the church grounds outside. The clearing of unnecessary trees, bushes, brush

and plants around the church was a major start. Next came the sodding of all the cleared areas to bring back our lawn making the church more visible and eye appealing. This has been followed by the landscaping of the church front entrance area along with the driveway center island. Added to this was the relining of all parking spots and no parking zones. Inside the church we had new programmable thermostats installed with a customized heating & cooling management system that is set for year round conditions. You will now see fans in all areas to help keep these costs down. This system is projected to save about an estimated \$3K-\$5K per year in electrical costs. We are also looking at our insurance costs and are projecting another possible \$2K-\$3K saving there also. There is still a lot more to do but without your financial contributions and the donations from businesses like **Don's Tree Services and Tuff Turf**Landscaping, we would not be able to present you with all these positive changes and results. You will be reading more in the Annual Report coming in January.

Despite the generosity of our congregation, we continue to struggle with a loss each month. November's loss is \$4,041.74 and the year-to-date loss is \$8,277.52. Our Operation account balance at the end of November is \$7,175.75, \$5,000 of which was transferred from our Wells Fargo account and includes a balance of \$715.60 in the Matching Funds account.

Due to the generosity of all who donated to our Matching Funds Campaign, we have been able to greatly improve the appearance of our Church and it can now be seen by all who pass by. Thank you for your continued support. *Barbara Horton, Treasurer*


