The Church Council consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Church Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and representatives from the Deacons, Teaching, Operations, Missions, Fellowship and Thrift Store. Teams.

OPERATIONS & FINANCE TEAM

As I stated in Last month's article, my job as Chairman of the Operations & Finance Team, as I see it, is to inform the church membership about the financial health as well as the condition of our assets (church building and property).



This month I will update the membership of our progress since December's article.

The church council has met a number of times and agreed the following repair and/or update projects are necessary to maintain and/or enhance our church buildings, grounds, the landscaping project donated by Tuff Turf Landscaping last year and present to the community we are a viable, growing church community in our mission of helping others, especially the older population but, if necessary we are willing to grow in other areas such as a viable youth program, or whatever it requires for our church to continue with our mission.

Irrigation System: As set forth in the December article, the old well failed. Tuff Turf was hired to drill a new well, place a pump and rework the existing irrigation system, testy and certify the new system. K&D Electric was hired to complete the conduit and wiring to the new pump. The new irrigation system installation should be completed and operational by the time you read this article. Cost to drill the well, pump and system operational test. \$6,300.00 K&D Electric, \$600.00 Total cost \$6,900.00.

Mix Building Roof Supports: The Mix Building (Thrift Store) roof (walkway) steel supports in the front and rear have been cleaned of corrosion, new supports welded on several posts, rusted through areas repaired, all work cleaned and painted with corrosion resistant paint by Johnson Welding & Fabrication at a cost of \$851.86 (Continued on next page)

Building Structure Rot: Areas of water intrusion and degrading of the window and wall structure was found above the church main entrance window area. Malibu Construction was hired to remove the degraded/rotted wood, window, trim and any other rotted or degraded areas, replace and/or rework the existing structure and make the area water tight. The cost is \$1,500.00

Toilet/Plumbing Issues: Ladies Toilet, men's urinal and prior pastor's office sink/plumbing issues were attended to by Shaffer Plumbing Service.

Site & Interior Lighting LED Retrofit: In a continuing effort to reduce our monthly electric bill exterior site lighting fixtures, and many interior fluorescent fixtures are being replaced with energy efficient LED fixtures and/or lamps. The fixtures and lamps have been donated by a church family; the church is paying for the installation. Installation cost \$1,000.00 Work is ongoing, expect completion end of December.

Exterior Structure Power Wash and Painting: All the exterior surfaces of our church buildings are in serious need of power washing, crack filling, painting of all exterior walls, doors, trim, metal posts and the cross. Your church council agreed this project is way past due and allocated \$10,000.00 for the project. Bids were sought and Premier Restorations provided the low bid of \$10,700.00. Through negotiations the owners agreed to complete the project for the allocated funds with a \$700.00 donation to our church. Please consider Premier Renovations for your next project. They are located right here in Port Orange. Work will commence January 10, 2022.

Security Cameras added to the Security System: Due to the need for additional security in/and around our facility the church council agreed to add a camera system to the existing security system.

APS Security & Fire System (our existing security system vendor) has been hired to install the new cameral system at a cost of \$3,195.00

Tree Work: Don's Tree service will trim and/or remove dead limbs, trees, etc., around the church property. Further they will remove a group of trees in the swale to the right of the Veterans Chapel. The cost is \$2,000.00.

Phone System: Our phone answering system is antiquated at best. Presently there is no direct phone answering available except when Kath is in the office Monday to Friday 9:00am to 1:00pm or when Pastor Glen nor someone else stops at the office and listens to the answering machine. The Thrift Store (presently a huge asset to our church family) has not phone answering capability. Kath has research options and found a system that will utilize the two existing Spectrum phone lines and allow an up to date answering system. Phone calls will be answered with a short welcome, next a caller will be prompted to select 1 through 6 for the Church Office, Pastor Glenn, Thrift Store, etc., that will be directed to that person's cell phone, except for Kath which will ring at her desk. The service is an additional \$79.00 per month.

Pest Control: Our pest control contractor has visited the church property and found evidence of rodent activities and has placed the required control devices. Part of the service contract, no additional cost.

Attic Space Above the Front Entrance: We need help sorting through the "stuff" stored in the space, removal and final cleaning. Anyone for a work party? Or do you know of a handyman that you can hire to complete this work?

Parking Lot Sealing & Restriping: Our asphalt parking areas are in desperate need of resealing. The sealing product protects our asphalt surfaces from degrading, when that happens the surface cracks and eventually requires replacement. We sought three bids to clean all paved surfaces, apply two coats of Polyner Seal Coat and restripe all parking and directional striping, replacement of broken curbs will also be completed. The low bid from locally owner Better Barricades was \$6,850.00


