## INTERIM PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Matthew 13:8 "But others fell on good ground and yielded a crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty."

I love to garden. I enjoy both vegetable and flowering gardens, but my favorite are the flowering gardens. This Spring I spend some time in choosing plants at the nursery, buying the pots and

the soil to plant them with. There were also several 'already potted planters' that found their way to our patio. Almost all of these plants have flourished to date.

I also purchased one tomato plant to round out the garden, as there is nothing tastier than a freshly grown, vine ripened tomato. I have tried to give this plant particular care. In my attempt to baby it, I even gave it some liquid fertilizer. Too much evidently, as many of the leaves turned brown and died, but with continued watering, it bounced back. Over this past week, we have had some very heavy rains and thinking it was receiving enough water, I left it unattended for about three days. When I saw it yesterday, I was horrified to find that again the leaves were withering and the plant dying because of the lack of water. In just one day of watering it has once again sprung back to life.

I love gardening because it reminds me of relationships and how much care and tending they need. People are very much like plants and faith communities represent the gardens. With the right amount of attention, watering, and feeding, we flourish. Without this attention, in just a short time a garden becomes stressed and on the verge of dying.

As we are now in our summer months, it is important that we keep intentionality in tending this garden called Port Orange UCC well watered. Watering means, keep working the "Invite someone to church" program, or when we note that someone hasn't been in worship for a couple of Sundays, instead of asking the pastor if he knows why, call them yourselves – it is far more powerful a message of "we are concerned about you."

This month we are stepping out in faith (once again) and hosting a VBS for the first time in years. As of this writing we have 5 children pre-registered. As a follow-up to the one day event (Saturday the 22<sup>nd</sup>), we will have a combined Sunday worship focusing on VBS on the 23<sup>rd</sup>, with a church family picnic following. These events are designed to build community.

The Operations Team met on May 8th and the following topics were addressed:

## **Old Business**

- Church Manual: This continues to be work in progress.
- Repair or Replacement of Down Spouts and Extensions: Project is ongoing.
- Ceiling Repairs and Painting of Jim Reed Room: Ceiling repairs are ongoing and painting on hold until repairs are completed.
- Charlie Mix Building Roof Repairs: Project is ongoing.
- Secure Finance Area/Divide Room: Painting has been completed.
- Chancel Railing: The railing has been installed.
- Parking Bumpers: Estimate will be obtained to repair the broken bumper.
- **Kitchen Ceiling Repairs:** Ceiling tile has been purchased and will be installed.
- Window Coating & Screen Replacement: Both projects are ongoing.
- Repair/Replacement Outside Prayer Box: Project is ongoing.
- **Sprinkler System:** System is fully operational and new larger cover boxes will be installed to protect the switches.
- Air/ Heat: Service 1<sup>st</sup> contract for one year.


### **New Business**

June 1<sup>st</sup> began our focus Mission on **Spruce Creek Elementary** for the months of June, July and August with a **KASH FOR KIDS** theme. We were lucky to have Ms. Tina Howard, SCE Social Worker, speak to the congregation's first service about the needs of so many of the children at her school. After hearing a few of her stories, many tears were shed by POUCC members. Church members are stepping up to our request of 'matching funds' to a dollar (\$) amount of their choice.


