OPERATION'S TEAM



Even though it summer and many of our church members & friends are traveling or visiting elsewhere, the need to maintain our church property both in and out, remains a steady responsibility. Often we overlook the obvious and focus just on things that "need" fixing when they break of stop working. Your Operations Team is looking at our church both long and short term for everything, not just those obvious things. Right now we have compiled a list that for the moment we shall call "The Dream List" but which more appropriately should be called our "Church Preservation List". This list will

be published shortly for all to see but for the time being you should know that we are looking at everything. The goal of this list will be to let you know where you can contribute – time, money, expertise, relationships, etc. so that you can help us remain a viable facility for year round activities. Watch for this list in the coming months.

Regarding some current business,

- 1. The Operations Team is reviewing ways that people can provide monetary gifts to our church that benefits both the giver and the church. One way is through the "Required Minimum Distribution" (RMD) that is a mandatory withdrawal from individual IRA retirement accounts after age 70 ½ years. We are looking at holding a brief education class this coming Fall.
- 2. We have received two air conditioning system maintenance quotes and will make a decision at our next Operations Team Meeting which to accept.
- 3. The church side door near the Pastor's office is going to be repaired and for the time being we have elected to place a sheet of Lexan over the door outside to prevent further damage, while we look at possible more permanent solutions.
- 4. Billy Wiggins has offered us a trailer to use for church related activities such as becoming the stage for Easter Sunrise Services at the beach. It may be possible to use this trailer for other needs, too. Thank you Billy!
- 5. The Operations Team is requesting that all Team Budgets for 2019 be submitted to Operations NLT October 30th. This is an important task that we must complete if we are to be prepared for the church budget review in January 2019.
- 6. Stewardship Sunday is October 28, 2018 and begins our annual Stewardship Campaign for the following year.
- 7. Pastor Glenn's installation ceremony will be held October 21 followed by a Fellowship Luncheon.

Again, thank you to everyone that contributes time or money to help maintain our church.

Next Operations Meeting is July 9th at 6:30 PM.

The Mission Team met with Creek's Liaison, Donna Wilkes on June 19th to determine what we want out funds to be designated for this year and we will continue as last year with our donations going towards Votran passes and SAT.ACT test scores. Ms. Wilkes has agreed to speak to the congregation again, as she did last year, sometime in August.

A trip will be made to **Boggy Creek** later this month with afghans given to us by Molly's Knit Wits and men's ties from Bob. Thank you both!

A reminder that **Daytona Beach Shores Mayor**, **Harry Jennings**, will be speaking at both services on **July 8th**. He will enlighten the congregation as to the needs of Halifax Urban Ministries and how and where our food items are used that are donated on Communions Sundays. Please plan on attending Thank You!

Regarding the **Women's Pregnancy Crisis Center**, two trips have been made in June with a car load of infant items — diapers, bathing tubs, potty seats, sound machine, many clothing items and a large box of maternity clothing, as well as, many other items. 
