SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Friends,

Stewardship is a powerful biblical term that stresses the primacy of our faithfulness to God by wise management of the resources God has placed in our care.

I want to speak with you for a few moments about stewardship – no, don't worry – I'm not going to plead with

you for money. That may be an easier "sell" than what I want you to think about with me. I want you to think about our stewardship of God's creation. Please, let's not talk about "global warming" – that phrase is both maligned and misleading. We need to focus on climate change. While we may disagree about the rates of change and all of the causes, there simply can be no denying that our world - its resources, creatures, and climate – are changing: species are dying, water is polluted, the soil is poisoned, and storms are increasing in both unpredictability and veracity. The wonder of it all is that the God who formed the heavens and the earth, whose glory is shown in the silence of a sunset and the cry of an infant, who sustains all things by loving power, actually has put Divine trust in us to manage the resources of the earth wisely. We are small, certainly. We are weak and confused and selfish and destructive and often hateful. Yet we are the ones on whom God is banking for the care of the wonderful creation. What is really going on? What are we doing? What can we do? Those are several questions we will address in a special five-week Sunday school class I will lead between services beginning July 13th. I will have curriculum with DVD presentations to help us all understand a little better what is going on and then we can think and pray about what we can do. As Jim Wallis puts it in a recent issue of Time:

Here is the moral narrative. What will your grandchildren's grandchildren ask about why we, and why you, did not do what was necessary for them? Why were we so selfish and short-sighted? Why didn't we care enough about the future of our world and theirs, to take care of our descendants? And here is the biblical and spiritual narrative: does care for God's creation really allow us to exploit the earth and its resources for short term economic self-interest? Is that good stewardship and the humble worship of God? It's time to stop denying science, denying our created instructions, and denying the sovereignty of God. Instead, let's start acknowledging our moral responsibilities.

Perish the thought -- and perish we would! We MUST care, and we MUST share our concerns with others and certainly with God through prayerful meditation with dedication.

Going on vacation? When packing your suitcase, be sure not to leave your prayers behind!

Our Operations Team has been busy addressing issues around the property and usage of our facility. Listed below are the highlights of the May meeting:

- 1. Sunrise Service Discussion was held on what we learned and could do better next year with regard to additional speakers and an enlarged platform.
- 2. Roof Repairs New decking and shingles were installed and inspected as of 5/22.
- 3. POUCC Insurance Policy New policy with the Insurance Board effective 5/8 and paid in full for 2014.
- 4. Veterans Chapel Walkway & grill pad completed on 5/22. Construction of fire pit will take place in the near future as well as the addition of bamboo blinds and ceiling fan.
- 5. Use of the Sanctuary for La Petite Pre-School Graduation on 6/2 was approved.

RA-TA-TAT—A God Moment from Pastor Beverly

While walking along a peaceful secluded road, I heard the sound of a ra-ta-ta-tat coming from one of the trees nearby. "It's gotta be a woodpecker," I thought as I approached the area from where the sound was coming. I narrowed it down to three

trees and focused more closely upon them -- looking up, down and all around. No woodpecker in sight, but still the ra-ta-ta-tat continued. One of the trees appeared to be dead, which, for a woodpecker, would hold the most attraction. "Okay, Mr. Woodpecker, I KNOW you're there!" I then slowly walked around that particular tree, searching up, down and all around for the elusive bird -- elusive, yet sharing its message loud and clear. Ra-ta-ta-tat, ra-ta-ta-tat. Again I walked around the tree from where the sound definitely was coming, looking up, down and all around. Still, no bird in sight. "Could he be inside the tree?" I thought. 
