SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE



2 John:6b As you have heard from the beginning, His command is that you walk in love.

June is upon us, which means that our attentions are starting to move toward summer activities. When I lived in the Central and the Northwestern parts of the country, this meant more outdoor activities. Attending baseball games, having picnics, the rodeo, hiking in the mountains, fishing along the river

banks are but a few of the outdoor activities that summer brings. It's a time for the family to gather together more frequently. There is a certain freeing up of schedules through the summer. Life seems to be moving at a more leisurely pace. There is no more school schedules and activities to be met and it is the time for family vacations. Ah those lazy days of summer!

We at Port Orange UCC have also started our summer schedule. The choir does not meet until Fall, the youth will not be meeting weekly but only twice a month, many of our committees will not be meeting over the summer. Since Easter we have seen a number of our members travel back up North to their summer home. In essence, we go into a kind of hibernation for the summer, programming wise. It is truly a time needed for respite and renewal from a very busy year. For those who are heavily involved with the activities of the church, we look forward to these summer breaks.

As a church, we have particularly worked very hard this past year in refocusing. We spent 4 months working on visioning and planning, and then over these past 4 months we have been working on the execution of this vision! The Cross Roads committees that were formed to help keep us on task are now starting to report in, helping assess our efforts and effectiveness. We received a report just last week from the committee that has been challenging us to invite someone to church on the 2nd Sunday of each month. In the three months of us inviting new people to worship, we have had 22 visitors that have registered their attendance. What are not reported were the extra 40+ people who came to our Palm Sunday worship, where we featured some of the Port Orange Music Academy students! There were 12 youth who played for us. A between services brunch was served and an Easter egg hunt provided, with 10 of those musicians searching for eggs; nor do we have a count of the number of visitors for the 10:45 Easter Worship at church.

Compare this to the 5 registered guests for the previous 5 months; you can see the positive effects of our special invitations and programming. The social media team has also come up with several ways of trying to expand our presence. With the number of hits we receive each week on our website, there is renewed focus on maintenance and how to expand information for those inquiring about us.

I wish to applaud everyone and you should give yourselves a huge pat on the back for all the work that you have been doing this past year. With this intentionality, there are new faces in our congregation. My deep concern is that we do not lose our momentum because of summer and the absence of our Northern members. This need to stay focused and engaged is extremely critical at this point, and here is why:

1) It will be harder to attract new visitors during the summer because of the appearance of lack of members in worship;

2) The need to show growth is absolutely vital in attracting your next settled pastor. As pastors read profiles, they are going to want to know not only what the vision and goals are of a church, but does the congregation actively work toward those goals;

3) If we do not keep working our goals, then we will fall back into a mindset that has prevented this faith community from growing in numbers in the past. To grow a church means to step outside of our comfort zone, continually. What the church in North America has forgotten over the years, is that to be an active community of faith that follows the teachings of Jesus, means to be living outside of the zone of comfort.

With this challenge laid before us, we are venturing out of our comfort zone once again with the presentation of a one day vacation bible school. This will occur on Saturday July 22^{nd} from 9 - 1 pm, with a follow-up combined Sunday worship which will include VBS and a family picnic after worship. We have advertized through a flyer to the Spruce Creek Elementary school as partners in this outreach. You may wonder why we are hosting a VBS when we have no children in the church under Junior High age. As part of our outreach and vision of growth, we are committed to attracting younger families and this can only be accomplished through intentionality. A part of our intentionality is that of reaching out to the students across the street and their families. What this means for you as a member of this congregation is a willingness to step up to the plate and help in some way to make this a successful event. There will be many areas of opportunity to help and as the time draws nearer more information of needs will be shared.

"As you have heard from the beginning, His command is that you walk in love." We at POUCC say we are a church that cares and shares. This is the active part of the command to walk in love. Love is an ever renewing process, one that takes intentionality, and never lets up, come summer, fall, winter, or spring. Let us continue to cultivate the love of God within our community and as gardeners be vigilant in our efforts.

- Window Coating & Screen Replacement: Both projects are ongoing.
- **Outside Prayer Box:** New lock for the box will be purchased and installed.

• **Sprinkler System:** The well casing had to be replaced and several heads and pipes were replaced and new bigger cover boxes will be installed to cover the switches.


