DEACONS' CORNER



Reverend Glenn Rice has been with us for the last three months. For those who have not yet had the opportunity to meet with him personally, I thought a question/answer session with Pastor Glenn might allow us all to get to know him a little better. *Charlie Baskin, Deacon's Chair*

CB: How do you like Port Orange and what the community offers?

Pastor: Port Orange is a great place to live. Sue, Kurt and I have adjusted nicely to our quiet neighborhood and the surrounding area. Being only a few minutes from the beach is an added plus. We look forward to exploring the vast amount of offerings and activities here in Volusia County.

CB: What has surprised you the most in your first three months at POUCC?

Pastor: The amount of people flowing in and out of the church facility during the week. I attribute much of this to the Thrift Store. It certainly has been a good way to meet many of you beyond Sunday mornings.

CB: You have tried some new things with our worship services. Some are new to you and some are new to the congregation. Most have come directly from the feedback of Deacons or members. What changes do you think have gotten the better results? What got the most negative feedback?

Pastor: For me, leading two different worship style services has been interesting but not as challenging as I expected. It's funny how I continue to hear how different the two congregations are because I find when we're not in worship, everyone is pretty much the same. Our entire congregation is a very loving and caring one with a good sense of helping others in our local community.

I personally have found, through my seminary training, how to understand and promote the historic church. I hold our two sacraments; Baptism and Holy Communion, very high. These are times during worship when we are closest to our God. I've tried to bring explanations to some of the symbolism used in our sanctuary. I find when people understand the 'what' behind the 'why', they tend to see the beauty, not just the pretty.

Our first attempt at having an Ascension Day worship was good. I believe I helped bring a better explanation of this important day in the life of Christ, even to those who were unable to attend. I'm not hearing, "what's this Ascension Day?" nearly as much.

CB: A nationwide survey of beliefs of UCC churches' membership showed 28% leaning progressive, 27% leaning conservative and 45% moderates. These numbers probably reflect our church as well. How would you fall in the progressive/conservative/moderate scale?

Pastor: I agree these percentages look to be represented here at POUCC. Although I feel I would fall in moderate category I would prefer to be labeled 100% in the category of Christian.

CB: How do you evaluate where we are as a church meeting God's mission for us? How can we improve?

Pastor: Our POUCC congregation is a really good one. We are a little different in a few ways, with every difference being a positive one. Having only 108 members, it's hard to believe we are seeing 120 or so in attendance on an average Sunday morning. We have two worship styles with very good talented and dedicated musicians helping lead both worship services.

We support many local Mission projects here in the Port Orange area. I am amazed at the contributions being made to help our local neighbors.

I continue to hear we need to have more young families with children attend our worships. I agree. The issue I see in our society is many younger families are not looking to attend any church. I am sensing a small turn around with this societal phenomenon. Throughout all history, people have always had a need of God in their lives; not always a religious one but a spiritual need for sure. My prayer is we (the entire congregation) live good Christian lives allowing others to see and feel the power of Jesus Christ through us. Go out and tell others of the goodness you feel as members of this Christian community. Don't feel afraid you will be labeled as a nutty Christian, rather embrace the Christian part. Be an ambassador; an advocate for God and ask others to find the Peace of Christ you have found here at POUCC. Bringing in new people, young or old, is a positive step forward for our Christian community. Bring a friend! Make a new friend. Be a friend in Christ.

CB: We welcome you to our church. We have the opportunity to work together to move our church forward in service to our church and community.

OPERATIONS



The POUCC Operation's Team is addressing a number of issues regarding the maintenance of our church.

- 1. This past month we had to replace a module in our church sanctuary's audio system. This new module has greatly improved the clarity and sound levels of the podium and pastor's lapel microphones.
- 2. POUCC Work Day was held on May 5th accompanied by a Pancake Breakfast. A HUGE "Thank You!" to everyone who attended and worked hard. The difference from this hard work was immediately noticeable both inside and outside of our church. One job had not been done in a decade or more removing dust from the sanctuary chairs. Trimming, removing, pruning outside are constant jobs as we all know, things in Florida just keep growing!
- 3. The glass door near the Pastor's office has cracked and must be replaced.
- 4. Gutter guards and possible gutter replacement are being priced for the Jim Reed Building.
- 5. A more robust church building security system is being evaluated.
- 6. Additional storage for the Thrift Store is being considered by converting one of the two outside utility rooms.
- 7. The Operations Team is developing a list of church needs and is preparing to present this "Wish List" to the congregation for support.

If you see anything that needs replacement, fixing, is broken or just plain requires a little "TLC", please let us know by contacting the church office.
