I sometimes believe our society has become so good at luring us in with their fancy advertising, we have become dependent on it. We are absolutely hooked on gimmicks.

Question: Why do so many people watch the Super Bowl? Answer: To see the new commercials and be part of the Monday morning conversations.

As I sit back and reflect on how people worship God in the community of others, I see a definite dependency on attending worship only when the **special** services are occurring. # OPERATION'S REPORT



Below is an update on things either completed, work in progress or needing discussion.

The **bathroom light fixture in the children's classroom -** wall behind it needs to be repainted around fixture. **Total Cost \$33.44** 

**DONE-** Powerstrip installed Finance Room per fire marshal inspection. Total Cost \$ 0

**DONE** -Installed NEW Exit signs - One in Jim Reed Building and one in sanctuary. Both LED and on AC with battery backup. **Total cost \$58.99** 

- **Roof Mix Building (Classroom).** Insurance claim filed, and insurance adjuster looked at roof May 3rd. We are waiting for roofing company (Lyon) to confirm insurance coverage approved so they can give us an estimate of replacement costs. We have a \$1,000 deductible in our policy. Lyon estimate will include additional cost of matching the shingles on Jim Reed Building, plus any incidental options we might select not covered by insurance. The gutters for example are not covered by insurance, only removal and reinstall of existing gutters are included. If we want new gutters (recommended) we need to get a separate estimate. Timing? New roof could be done by mid-June. **POUCC Cost projection without new gutters \$1,500 +**/-
- **Church grounds.** We need to look at how we can keep cleaning up the church grounds. The area behind the Veteran's Chapel needs to be trimmed back as well as the gulley for water runoff. Both are getting very shaggy looking. The area behind the pastor's office needs cleaning out. These areas will require a one of two church workdays. What thoughts do you have for doing this since our two past work days were sparsely attended?
- Church painting The exterior concrete walls have been stained by irrigation water and some paint has started peeling. I painted exterior walls in most obvious spots including scraping peeling paint in one area. Painted around Jim Reed entry door that was all yellow. (probably due to using paint affected by hot sun heat over time). Additional areas still need painting. Cost 3 gallons paint \$120.21
- Sanctuary Front Spotlights the spotlights over banners in the sanctuary were replaced with LED low power cool spotlight bulbs. Cost \$26.82

# FOOD BASKET SUNDAY




