Your Operations Team is busy with ongoing and new projects around the church.

- Susie Greiff presented the Treasurer's Report and stated that we are doing better than projected through April. We will be transferring \$75,000 from the Benevolent account into a CD where it will earn more interest
- Shredder Day was held on Saturday May 21st and we were able to purge and dispose of old files.
- The "No Parking" striping in the front and rear of the church was completed Tracy & Dallas Davis.
- A "Mulch Day" to trim bushes, weed and mulch will be held on Saturday, June 1st (see article below).
- Pastor Bill gave an update on the Veterans Chapel.
- APS security systems joined us to discuss an estimate for updating our alarm system and making it a monitored system. (See article below.)
- Downspouts will be cleaned out in June.
- Roof was checked for leaks and repaired.

I'm sure you all have noticed, thanks to Tracy & Dallas Davis, we now have designated **NO PARKING ZONES** around the perimeters of the Church. This will help us to preserve the curbing. Also, the Staff Parking will be moving to the east side of the building so that we can upgrade and expand our Handicapped Parking area. *Tracy and* No Parking Dallas, you did a super job and let's all observe the new No Parking Zones!

We are upgrading and expanding our alarm system for the Sanctuary and also the Jim Reed Room. Please note, anytime after 3:00 PM the alarm will be set and if tripped, the police will come.

Since there are so many duplicate keys floating around, the outdoor and office locks are being rekeyed. New keys will be signed out of the office. We want to insure staff and lay leaders have access that they need and deserve, but we also want to limit unnecessary access and improve building security. Both actions we take will make POUCC a safer place for all and will save money on our insurance.

DISASTER MANAGEMENT

We Respond to Disasters



Before disasters happen, we meet with our disaster ministry partners and we decide on unique tasks for each of us. The United Church of Christ has declared itself to be dedicated to doing long-term recovery. Other partners do the thing they declared to be what they do best. So some partners are best at doing immediate debris removal, some are best at moving a mobile kitchen into the disaster area and preparing meals, and all of the other partners have their unique tasks.

This being the case, we will wait until the people of Moore, Oklahoma, are organized and ready for our volunteers to come and help them to rebuild. It will probably take six to ten months for this to happen.

It has taken eleven months for the people of Columbia and Suwannee Counties to organize and prepare for volunteers to come to them to help repair flood damaged homes. We need volunteers now to help more than 400 families recover from the damage done by Tropical Storm Debbie. In the future, when they are ready for us, we will be seeking volunteers to go to Moore, Oklahoma. Now, during the week of June 22-29, we need fifteen to twenty volunteers who can help repair roofs, help replace damaged dry wall, and other similar projects.

Through Church World Service, which we support, many cleanup bucket kits, hygiene kits and baby kits have already been sent to Oklahoma. We now need your help to replace the kits which were sent so that when the next disaster occurs we have a new supply of kits to send to those people.


