Dear Friends,

Frogs have been on my mind a lot lately. You may not be fond of frogs but we can learn something from them. They served to remind me of an important spiritual lesson by two recent

incidents. First, a few weeks ago, as I was seated on the couch working on my laptop, I heard a loud plop on the carpet. Nina was upset and kept circling at the other end of the couch so I got up to see what was going on out of my sight. To my surprise a large frog (who had evidently been crawling on the ceiling) had fallen on the carpet. I quickly got Lisa's lizard net and relocated the reptile outside! Then a few days later, as I was driving on I-95 at Mario speed (private joke), a tree frog climbed up out from under the dashboard inside of the windshield in my truck. I thought, if he jumps on me, there's going to be a crash. I opened the passenger side window and eventually he jumped right out. I'm not sure he survived the landing but at least he was gone! Two things I am thankful for in the aftermath of these encounters. First, that Lisa was not around on either occasion. Second, that through them I was reminded me of a truth I needed to hold onto during difficult times. And I certainly did that last month during my health scare and subsequent hospitalization (BTW I am fine and receiving treatments). What is that truth? The letters to the word **FROG** stand for "Fully **Rely On God.**" I realize that this statement is not new to many of you – it wasn't to me either but its meaning was certainly punctuated! As I spent a day in the ER and three more days undergoing tests, I had a lot of time to think and reflect. I certainly had the opportunity to reconsider my life, my priorities and how little control any of us really have on what life will bring. A lesson remembered and perhaps relearned. Not a bad lesson for all of us to keep in our hearts and minds during all the times of our lives – not just the difficult ones.



WEST PROPERTY UPDATE



Dear Friends,

These are exciting days for our church as we upgrade our programs and expand our facilities. One of our current projects is the development of the west property. As you know, the property has been cleared over the last year and we are ready for Phase I of the building – which will be a 24 foot square concrete pad and a steel roof to create a Pavilion for use in worship, picnics, and other special events such as concerts and blessings for bikes and pets.

Ric Pountain shared an idea with me that I heartily agree with - that is, the naming and establishment of the Pavilion and property for our Veterans. By doing so, we not only honor those who have served and

who still serve today, but also we remember those who gave their lives for the freedoms and opportunities we have today as well. Needless to add, that such a designation would also honor those who have gone before us as leaders and saints in the church as well. During our Root Party last December, when discussing where we could start our first building, Bob Brewster called the area later chosen for Phase I as "The Chapel among the Pines". So, I would like to call it the Veterans Chapel. *The Church Council heartily and unanimously approved of this designation and fundraising effort at their February meeting.*

Where do you fit into this effort? I believe that those military veterans in our church can help us get this first Phase up and completed by the end of the summer. I have sent a letter to our veterans requesting a small (and over and above pledged) gift from each one to help make this happen. There are nearly 30 veterans active in our church and if each one could make a gift of \$200, Phase I will be 50% funded. Some may not be able to afford \$200, and some may want to give more! Whatever the gift amount, we would be most thankful and appreciative for their generosity. We are offering this opportunity to the congregation as well but I wanted our veterans to have the chance to lead us now as they have in the past. 


