## SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,



A while back, I was grocery shopping at Winn-Dixie – not one of my favorite chores or stores – but I like the Fuel Perks! About midway in the store, I was walking up an aisle and suddenly heard a beeping sound on the far end of the aisle. An elderly woman, riding her electric scooter, had decided to back up. She was all the way at the far end and had it in reverse at high speed as people were diving to the sides of the aisle to get out of her way! She backed up the entire length of the aisle to where I was - standing in disbelief - only to turn into the next aisle. I wanted to ask her, "Why didn't you just turn the corner at the far end?" but a glance at her face told the story. She was confused and overwhelmed, so I just simply said, "Have a nice day."

She smiled and went on with her shopping and driving. There are some good lessons to be learned here – and more than just be aware and cautious of other drivers – no matter what their vehicle! I believe as we enter Lent. there are many who need to stop going in reverse with their spiritual lives. We tend to back step and retrace our lives – especially our mistakes and our regrets leaving us confused and overwhelmed. For me, Lent is not a time to feel sorry for ourselves, beat ourselves up, or taking a somber attitude about the state of our lives. Lent is a time for turning corners and starting again. Lent is a time for letting go and letting God. After all, that is at the heart of Lent and the Gospel – the transformative power of God's Love to help us find forgiveness and renewal. Our Lenten Theme is "Giving Up for Lent." An overview is on page eight of this newsletter. We begin by joining with three other area UCC churches here for an Ash Wednesday observance. I hope you will come. I hope you will think and pray about how you need to turn a corner in your relationship with yourself, with others, and ultimately, with God. I pray that all of us will stop going backwards with regret and pain and move forward into the resurrection victory God has made possible through Jesus Christ! Pastor Bill

With the recent passing of Mary Daigneau, I now recognize that our spirits had been connected through song for several years, beginning with my singing at the baptism of one of her grandsons. Two days before Mary passed, I sang to her many of the old hymns, and felt blessed by her smiling eyes as she mouthed the words along with me. When I arrived at her bedside the morning she passed, I quietly sang to her The Lord's Prayer.

When I sat down to write this article with nary a thought in my mind as to what to write, it suddenly all came to me, beginning with Mary. God had also blessed me through the spirit of music with the precious memories of Helen McGuffie and Jim Hopkins.

A few days before her passing, I gave to Helen McGuffie a copy of "*The Lord's Prayer*" which I had typed in large print per her husband's request. Although I had never sung it before, in a God Moment I was moved to sing it for Helen and Jim before I left that day. It came as no surprise to me that God also "nudged" me at Helen's graveside service to do the same. This was affirmed when Jim said to me afterwards, "THAT'S why I wanted you to be here!"

Jim Hopkins sang tenor as a long-time devoted member of our choir, so we had an obvious musical connection. The anthem "My Jesus, I Love Thee" is a favorite for many of us, although it is becoming more and more difficult to sing because of its powerful message along with exquisitely written music. There is a two-measure tenor line in the third verse which makes my spirit soar as I close my eyes and listen to the men sing: I'll love Thee in life, I will love Thee in death, And praise Thee as long as Thou lendest me breath.

I thank God for each of you, dear departed saints of Port Orange United Church of Christ, and I thank Him for our very special connection -- even now -- through the blessing of sacred music.

#### OPERATIONS TEAM



A BIG THANK YOU to all who helped with the Church Workday held Saturday January 25, 2014. The next work day will be scheduled in the spring to coincide with additional work being done on the Veteran's Chapel.

The first Operations Team meeting, with our new team members in attendance, was held on **February 10th**. Bob Gaither took the time to read the scope of responsibilities as written in the POUCC Church By-Laws at the beginning of the meeting. This was very helpful, especially for those who are new. We discussed repairs that are needed within

the church buildings and on the property (e.g. sanctuary doors attention, roof supports rusting on the Charles Mix Building, and new roofs needed for the sanctuary and Jim Reed Room).

Additional on-going items that were discussed included:

- -2014 Easter Sunrise Service, permit has been approved but not yet received.
- -The swale on the West Property is deemed a retention pond by the City of Port Orange. This area may be sprayed twice a year to help with weeds and mosquitoes.
- -The current contract with our cleaning service is up for renewal. We will review the contract to see what our best options are for either renewal or replacement of the service provider.
- -The church insurance policy is also up for renewal. We will be reviewing the church's insurance policy to again see what our best options are for proper coverage and affordability.
- -Additional closet space needed for more storage in the sanctuary.

The church has been approved by the Department of Elections to serve as a polling place for the August 26<sup>th</sup> and November 4<sup>th</sup> elections.

Other business: Sherian Buller was elected as chair for the 2014 term. The meeting time for Operations was voted and approved to be moved to start at 6:30pm. The next Operations Meeting is scheduled for **Monday March 10, 2014** @ 6:30pm. In Faith, Sherian Buller, Chair of Operations

## PORT ORANGE MINISTERIAL NOTES



At a recent Port Orange Ministerial Meeting, we met with Port Orange Police Chief Gerald Monahan and Crime Prevention Officer Serena Besuden. The officers presentation was interesting and I have listed below a number of topics that are of importance to all residents of Port Orange.

- 1. While there has been a significant drop in violent crime, property crimes are on the rise—mostly involving auto theft. Please make sure you remove all valuables from your vehicles and make sure they are locked.
- 2. The City is offering Women's Self Defense Classes on a regular basis. Cost is \$5.00 a person and if you are interested you may contact Officer Besuden at the Port Orange Police Department.
- 3. The Police Department offers a Vacation or Snowbird House Watch. Again, if interested contact the department for further details.
- 4. A 9-week Citizens Police Academy is offered on Monday evenings beginning in January.
- 5. National Drug Take Back Day is scheduled for **Saturday**, **April 26th**.
- 6. The Citizens Observers Program is designed to allow you to go online and report concerns in your neighborhoods. The website is citizenobserver.com.
- 7. For those families with special needs children or elderly loved ones, the City is offering a Wanderers Assist Program. You simply register them with the Police Department and they remain in the database if the need should arise.

For more information on any of these programs go to the Port Orange Police Department Facebook page or their website.

Unfortunately, the hottest topic at the meeting was our traffic problems. As they explained traffic programs are the responsibility of the state and they are addressing the problems of congestion and policing of streets in West Port Orange. *Pastor Bill*


