SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Friends

... just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. ROMANS 6:4

A story is told about a new graduate from the seminary who went out to his first congregation, an old country church. As he was conducting his first worship service, he noticed right away that everyone sat on one side of the church. That seemed odd. When it came time to sing the sermon hymn, the new pastor was amazed to see the entire congregation stand up, walk over to the other side of the church and sit down to sing. Weird! No one explained it to him. The same thing happened week after week. Finally the pastor pieced it together: Many years earlier, the church was heated by a woodstove over on one side of the building. The building was cold during the winter. When people first got to church, everyone sat on one side, close to the woodstove. As the service would go on, the woodstove would get very warm, too warm for comfort, and so the congregation developed the practice of moving over to the other side of the church before the sermon hymn. Even though the church building had been remodeled several times and the woodstove had long since been replaced, the congregation still kept its practice of changing sides during the services. Most of the members didn't even know why; it was just something they did every Sunday. As we are making our way to Easter Sunday, it is appropriate and necessary that we question who we are, why we do what we do, and be willing to challenge old assumptions and ways of being the church. Otherwise, we deny the power and the purpose of the resurrection – namely to bring new Life to that which is no longer useful, needed, and perhaps even be dead! Some churches simply go through the motions or do what they've always done, some have long since "gone to seed." Thank you for your faith. Thank you for your love. Thank you for your courage. Thank you for witnessing and spreading Life in and through this church, community, and world!

Your Operations Team met on February 9th and the following topics were discussed:

- Winsemius Bequest – Sue Turner is obtaining quotes for new kitchen equipment.
- Repairs and maintenance around the church and grounds: Dalen Mills has labeled the Sanctuary dimmers and switches; is looking into repairing the bench in the front of the church; replacing the bell outside of the Jim Reed room; determined repair of the roof is a non-issue. Jim Eagan will be addressing parking lot crack repairs once the weather warms up and will also address the concrete abutments that need repair (Pastor's and one by the Nursery). Prayer Garden bricks have been installed.
- Purchases approved: Florescent light supply; locked filing cabinet for the Finance Office.
- It was decided that more research on the AT&T account and the cell phone was required.
- Spring Workday has been scheduled for **April 18th**.
- Easter Sunrise Service — Permit has been received.
- Special Olympics cycling team is practicing Saturdays 1-3 PM in the parking lot.
- Functions recently hosted were well attended and received: Spiritual Life January 24th and the New Beginnings Conference on January 30th & 31st.
- Chairperson — I requested that Bill Greiff assist me as Co-Chair as a non-voting member and the Council has approved my request.

For years I have thought about the events of my very early youth and especially when I attended Sunday school. More specifically I have thought about Mrs. Bach - one of my Sunday school teachers. I wish I could remember her first name but even without that I do remember her soothing and calm manner when discussing what the Bible's teachings could mean in our daily lives. I wish I could remember a specific lesson or even a specific "gold nugget" that she planted in my mind that would forever be treasured. But, I don't remember those either. However, I do remember how impressed I was with Mrs. Bach and how I had at that time in my life respected her age (perhaps 70's) and her wisdom. She had a way of imparting her wisdom to us that was more feelings than it was facts. At the time, I might have been in my early teens, that period of time in life where nothing makes sense and where everything can be a crisis. Yet, Mrs. Bach seemed to understand. She taught us that life was to be exciting, treasured and not wasted. I have thought about her over the years, so why am I writing about her now? Why am I telling all of you about a Sunday school teacher who I only saw perhaps 3-4 times a few months one year of my life over 50 years ago? Why share her with all of you? Because a few days ago, I was flipping through an old photo album and there she was. There was Mrs. Bach dressed in her best dress, wearing a round hat with a big flower on it. The kind of hat you would see in the 1930's or 1940's. There she was in a picture proudly standing beside me at my college graduation with a big smile of accomplishment on her face. After all these years, her picture rekindled the thoughts of what she had been sharing with me and others so long ago. Jesus wants us to live life to the fullest. Be everything we can be. Use all our talents. That is why we are here. God wants us to live life not just occupy life. Think about who has influenced you. Perhaps, you also have an old Sunday school teacher named Mrs. Bach or someone else like her in your life.

TERRIFIC TUESDAYS



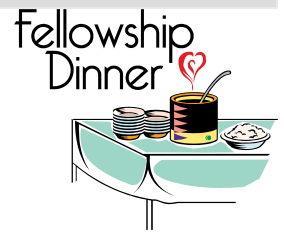
Terrific Tuesdays

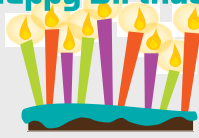

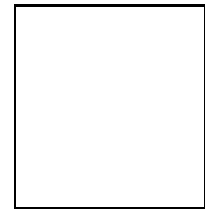

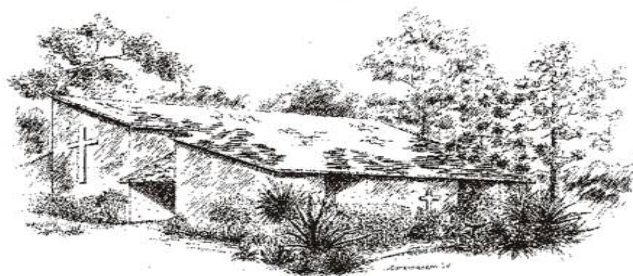
