SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,



What an awesome Easter we had! Yes, the weather at Winter Haven Park was less than desirable AND not what had been forecast -25+ mph winds were howling with sand and misty rain flying! We had

some issues with the sound, the setup, serving communion, what to do with jelly beans given in the offering plates, and my chalice fell and shattered on the sand, etc.! WHO CARES? The Easter miracle still happened again as 700-800 bravely came out to worship on the Beach. The Praise Team and volunteers for the Sunrise service worked very hard to get ready and overcame the conditions with thanksgiving. The Sanctuary Choir and Dr. Tom's music was awesome at the second service! We celebrated a baptism on the Beach and welcomed three new members in our Sanctuary service as well – God is good! I am thankful (as I know you are) to so many who helped make Easter here both meaningful and memorable. The picture on this page was given to me by John and Linda Councilman of Port Orange this Easter from last year's service. That's what it is all about! Christ is Risen - Alleluia! What do we do now and how do we live in the meantime as children of God and disciples of Jesus Christ? We still struggle and have challenges every day. Paul Brandeis Rauschenbush put it this way:

Easter does not erase crucifixions of oppression and personal trials that humans face. It does not have that power, nor that goal...Easter does not erase any of it -- instead it shines a spotlight on those crucifixions and proclaims that the power of death and sin can and has been shattered by the power of love... Easter matters because it reminds us that God is with us, and loves us, even amidst all of our sufferings. Easter matters because it proclaims a faith that even in 2014, God is pouring forth the powerful spirit of new life to resurrect our personal lives and our world. Easter is a call upon the Christian to turn to face the crucifixions in our lives and in the world; encouraged and emboldened by Christ, to believe that we too can rise.

Brothers and Sisters, I hope that through Christ's example and the power of God's love, you will rise above your circumstances in the coming months. I pray that you will help someone in need, stand. I hope you will experience a love you desperately need and will have the courage to share it. I hope that the Resurrection (if it has not already) becomes real for you until we meet on the Beach next year – I hope and pray that you can acclaim: "I have seen the Lord!"

To date the Store has deposits totaling \$386,721 which not only greatly help our congregation but helps us help many others. 841 mothers received baby supplies and we celebrated the birth of 553. To date this year, they have aided 543 mothers and have celebrated the births of 121 babies. Your donations to this special collection are greatly appreciated and will benefit those in the greatest of need.




