SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Easter greetings in the name of the Lord,

My first two months as your pastor have been great. The highlight so far has been Easter Day. Being a part of the Easter sunrise worship was one I won't forget. Yes, we didn't actually see the sun rise over the Atlantic Ocean but we knew it was there. Interestingly enough, we don't actually see God's son but we know he is always there.

As we move through this season of Easter, the theme of Mission, helping others, continues to be a big part of our congregation. It certainly is good to know we are reaching out into our community and helping make it a better one.

This season of Easter continues until Sunday, May 20; Pentecost Sunday. A very important day during this season is the fortieth day, Ascension Day; the day Jesus ascended into heaven.

During my seminary years, I began to wonder why Ascension Day had all but stopped being observed in the Protestant church. It certainly is a scriptural event, the Protestant Reformation didn't reject it, and in some ways it is just as important as Good Friday and Easter Day; because without the Ascension, how could we be assured of Jesus' authority? It has been suggested Ascension Day is no longer enthusiastically celebrated because it doesn't fall on a Sunday and no one gives or receives any presents!

According to the Epistle reading in Acts 1, Jesus appeared to his disciples for forty days after his resurrection, then he was taken up before their eyes into heaven. So the church has historically celebrated the Ascension on the sixth Thursday after Easter, which equates to the fortieth day.

This year following our 6:00 pm monthly Fellowship Dinner, we will be having an Ascension Day worship service on Thursday, May 10 at 7:15 pm. Plan to be a part of this worship service as we remember how Christ's ascension means that in heaven there is one who, knowing firsthand the experience of suffering and temptation, prays for us and perfects our prayers.

Typically, we do not give or receive earthly presents on Ascension Day but we continually receive Christ's love; the best present of all. Every new day is a witness that Jesus is alive, and the hope that brings us, is as sure and certain as daylight itself.

Yesterday, while sitting at the stoplight at Beville Road by Sam's Club, I watched as a mother with her baby in a stroller waited for the crosswalk signal to change in their favor. The instant she took one step forward after seeing that it was safe to cross the street, a speeding car raced towards the mother and child in order to make the turn into the parking area for Sam's Club. I gasped in horror in that split second, dreading what appeared to be inevitable. Even God must have gasped in that moment as He veered the

car what had to have been barely an inch in order to prevent a tragic outcome. What a God Moment!

Recently, someone commented to me that they had never seen a church blessed with as many miracles as we at POUCC have experienced -- a true testimony to our active prayerful lives as is witnessed and spiritually experienced each and every Sunday when we lift our intercessory prayers both vocally and silently. Here are but a few examples of lives changed through the prayers of our church family:

Three very young children are now thriving after surviving the frightening odds of brain surgery. A family member is now thriving after surviving many surgeries for injuries resulting from a motorcycle accident from which many feared he would not survive.

A family member who, within a three-year span, survived two major open-heart surgeries, two separate life-threatening internal bleeds, and emergency surgery for a hernia which also caused an obstructed bowel is finally doing well.

Some of you may not be aware of one of our church family members who actually "coded" during cardiac surgery. He was greeted "on the other side" by one of his family members who had previously passed who told him to choose life because his work on earth was not yet done. It doesn't get any more powerful than that!

We praise God for the many blessings of prayers answered in obvious ways for us to recognize as well as prayers answered in ways unknown to us. Your family at POUCC praises you, Lord, for giving us a powerful spiritual gift of prayer with which we glorify you!

OPERATIONS TEAM



Our Operations Team has been busy addressing issues around the property and listed below are the highlights of the April Meeting.

- Work Day & Pancake Breakfast- May 5TH, 7:30 AM-Noon. All able bodies are encouraged to attend for pancakes and the workday participation. A work day idea (things that need to be done) signup sheet is at the back of the sanctuary.
- The Thrift Store requires more dedicated storage so Operations is looking at converting the concrete walled storage shed for this purpose. The second shed will be reorganized to hold items removed from the first shed.
- Several church security systems augmenting the current system have been reviewed and will be presented to the church council.
- The church sanctuary lights are being looked at for replacement with softer light dimming LED bulbs.

- New light fixtures were donated and installed outside of the Pastor's Office.
