Thought for the Month: God is Still Speaking!

From the Pastor's Desk:

For most of my ministry, I have included the words: "Friends, God is still speaking. And we are still listening" after reading the scripture each Sunday. In addition to it being part of a United Church of Christ motto, it has always reminded me that the Bible is the

inspired word of God, written down by man and not the exact word of God. It keeps me focused as I work on my weekly messages by cautioning me to be careful in how I research, interpret and write in the message.

I recently read this story told by the Rev. Peter Panagore in his book, *Two Minutes for God*(2007), and I thought it tied in nicely with the continuing work of the United Church of Christ associated with the motto: "God is Still Speaking". I never knew where the expression came from until I read this and then checked it out.

> For the young among us, George Burns and Gracie Allen were a vaudeville comedy team and marital partners who also performed on radio and on television. Gracie, who was actually the brains, heart, and soul of the partnership, played a lovable airhead whose misunderstandings were laughable. At the end of their. shows, George would say, "Say goodnight, Gracie." She'd say, "Good night, Gracie."

When she was dying, she feared for George. In the final love note she penned to him just before she died, she wrote, "Never place a period where God has placed a comma....." (another motto used by the UCC).

Lots of us, for all sorts of sincere reasons, have put periods where we ought to have commas:

God doesn't love me (period). God is not there for me (period). God has abandoned me (period). I do not believe in God (period). God does not like Muslims or Blacks (period). God says being a homosexual is wrong (period). Women do not belong in the pulpit (period).

The thing is, God sincerely believes in us (period). Each and every one of us are made in God's image (period). Sometimes our own ideas get in our way. Sometimes we do all we can to block God out, by putting periods and "No Trespassing" signs all over our lives. We need to remember that God is still speaking to us, if only we would remove the periods and add a comma or two here and there.

This story is representative of the 2004 UCC initiative expressed through the "God is Still Speaking" campaign. The campaign has reflected the need for the United Church of Christ to spread its message of extravagant welcome which continues to historically reshape our understanding of the Christian faith and proclamation. The campaign's goal has been to let everyone know that anyone could find a spiritual home in the United Church of Christ, be strengthened and nurtured in their faith and be blessed to reach out to others with their God-given gifts and talents.

Today, as part of the United Church of Christ under one collective identity, we can enthusiastically lift up that the UCC is a welcoming, justice-minded Christian community. At a time when religion is too often portrayed as narrow-minded and exclusive, many are raising their VOICES for an alternate vision, one –

- Where God is all-loving and inclusive.
- Where the Church of Jesus Christ welcomes and truly accepts everyone as they are.
- Where your mind is nourished as much as your soul.
- Where Jesus the healer meets Jesus the revolutionary.
- Where together we grow a just and peaceful world.

Today in 2023, this concept is still reflected in a shorter form of "God is still speaking" using the simple term "Stillspeaking." The message is the same and reminds us that God still has a lot more to say and we have more to listen to. It has helped churches and individuals across the country make religion relevant again and to extend an extravagant welcome to all – because "no matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here." Here in the United Church of Christ, of which we at POUCC, are an integral part.

May we all work tirelessly to live out the commandments of Christ to love God and love our neighbors remembering that God is still speaking to us, even in 2023

May God shower you with many blessings in the month of May.


