# SENIOR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends.

It has probably become more of a household phrase than it was anticipated to be nearly 20 years ago. "If you build it, they will come" – is a corruption of the actual movie quotation, "If you build it, he will come." We're talking,

of course, about the movie, Field of Dreams (1989), nominated for three Academy Awards. The movie that starred Kevin Costner as the farmer Ray Kinsella and if you still have not seen the movie – rent it – it's worth the time and investment. Still, if we build it, will they come? All that is required is our dedication and participation, right? Please say "Yes." As we continue to live with the space constraints of our facilities, we wonder about the future of our church. Surely, going into debt without a sense of vision and commitment would be foolish. Recently, I read about the world's largest church facility - The Basilica of Our Lady of Peace of Yamoussoukro is listed in Guinness World Records - surpassing the previous record holder, Saint Peter's Basilica. It has an area of 30,000 square meters (322,917 sq. ft.) and is 158 meters (518 ft.) high and located in Cote d'Ivoire (Ivory Coast) in West Africa. More than 1,500 people erected that cathedral, and they did it in only four years. Saint Peter's Basilica took 100 years. The cost to build it was \$300 million! The problem is not just the size of the building. It's not just the ornate architecture. It's the fact that this massive cathedral in a povertystricken country (where the annual income is @ \$650), for the most part, remains empty. There are about 350 members who call this church home. There's room for 18,000! Clearly, the church is not a building but a people. Facilities simply facilitate the people gathering for worship, study and service. As a few of our leaders attended the "Come and See" event at our UCC congregation in New Smyrna Beach a few weeks ago, we learned a lot about what is going on in churches everywhere and the common challenges we face. One statistic that clearly hit us hard was that – on average – only 17% of Americans attend worship regularly anymore. Wow! How will we respond to that reality at POUCC? Where do we focus our future plans and resources to meet a changing community and world? Clearly, a building will not reach the lost and lonely. What makes our church - and any for that matter - is people. Our wonderful church is about you – the people – and is so much more than a building. Thank you for your support, love and commitment. Keep looking up and reaching out! PASTON BI

# OPERATIONS TEAM

The Operations Team met on October 13th and the following topics were discussed.

#### **Old Business:**

• The church workday went very well. The grounds look very well groomed because of the volunteers that helped. The firepit was formed and more flagstone is to be added. In addition, the Turners donated and installed a new sign for Veterans Chapel.



- We need 5 orders for personalized bricks for the Prayer Garden. More people have said they will be placing orders so we should make our minimum order of 5 needed by 11/16.
- PayPal link to website is still in the implementation testing mode. There were no updates to add.
- Winsemius Bequest/Home Sale no update.
- The insurance check was received for the lightning damages. (\$2,649).
- Spiritual Retreat  $-\frac{1}{24}/2015$  there will be a fund raising event on Election Day.

#### **New Business:**

- 2015 Church Budget Susie prepared a preliminary budget spread sheet for the Team to review. Changes were discussed and those changes will be presented at the November meeting.
- 2015 Stewardship Campaign Pastor Bill has a Pledge Letter/Form completed for mailing.
- City of Port Orange is having a public hearing to discuss a fence a neighbor has erected. The Team agreed we will not get involved.
- New Beginnings Program It was discussed whether to participate in this program. Having the funds at this time is just not feasible, and other issues/concerns were raised as well (timing, the needs of our church, etc.). Team recommended to the Council we not participate.
- Paving the Parking Lot/Driveway Jim Eagan attended the meeting with concerns. The blacktop is in need of repairs either with resurfacing or patching. Cement abutments need to be replaced or fixed in some way to prevent an accident. Funding for this project will be discussed in November.

#### **Other Business:**

- Lighting light by outside door is not working. Need wooden tops made for over wells.
- Recommended to the Deacons the elimination of the Youth Minister and Nursery Attendant positions from the 2015 Budget, which are both vacant at this time.
- Nominations for the 2015 Operations Committee were discussed.

The next Operations Meeting is scheduled for November 10th @ 6:30pm.


