Your POUCC Operations Team does not have a lot to report. Fortunately we have had no major storms or repairs. The air conditioning for the middle (business) office had a blower motor failure that required a replacement at a cost of \$285.00. One church member pointed out that several steel supports for the classroom building overhang are corroded & rusted through. This may require either replacement or welding to repair, which is something we will be looking at next year. We added night

lights to the two sanctuary bathrooms after one of our members recently experienced a complete blackout in the ladies bathroom when the lights were inadvertently turned off. We need to thank everyone who works on the church grounds by trimming, planting, picking up branches, pulling weeds, etc. as they feel things need to be done. We have a lot to take care of on our church property and all these individual efforts contribute greatly to keeping our church appearance presentable and welcoming. Please note that the income and expenses do not include Missions. In September, we had our usual quarterly expenses (insurance and pension) of about \$5,000 and went significantly into the red. The Operating Account has run out of money. We have been forced to use the benevolent/emergency fund to pay some of the church's expenses through the end of the year. Our Halloween Party was a lot of fun with "creepy" food and games for everyone.


