OPERATIONS

There are many ways for our church to grow and evolve. Fortunately, at POUCC, we have members and friends who truly believe in our church and its unique place in both our community and in our world. As a place of Christian worship and renewal, we are very fortunate that past decision makers decisively invested in building a strong church facility on very useable land. Today, as we celebrate our 40th Year Anniversary, we continue to be Around the blessed with members and friends who want to see our church remain viable and active for many more decades into the future. Our Church Matching Funds Program has been a huge success as financial donations now match the initial \$5,000 with more continuing to be added to make the church operations fund even stronger. These funds are being used in a very visible way. As our church continues to grow to meet the demands of a changing community and world, we are tasked with making sure our grounds and facilities are maintained to be both long term and financially sound. The funds being raised are making sure this happens. Anyone visiting our church today will easily observe great changes in our grounds. Trimming and weeding can only go so far here in Florida. Our grounds needed "major" attention and the results speak for themselves. Working with **Don's Tree Services, Inc.**, a long-time established business in our area, we have gone forward with an aggressive removal of trees, palmettos and other ground covers no longer attractive or impossible to maintain. (It should be noted here that Don's Tree Services donated a portion of the work they performed. For this donation, we need to be very grateful and in return we need to recommend them to others whenever tree work is required. Coming next? We will be seeding and sodding portions of the cleared areas after which we will looking at a special landscaping plan. Our paved parking areas need attention. The West property around Veteran's Chapel needs clearing and improving. More will come on this as the plans are finalized. In summary, a huge "thank you" to all who have donated money and time to our church operations fund. Please continue to give as we will be moving forward on improving our church facilities and grounds with other projects. Pass the word. Let others know that we are improving & growing for the future. Our September income of \$10,278.25 includes \$2,000 which has been donated to our Matching Funds Campaign. Our loss for both September and Year-To-Date is partly due to our Tithe and Offering income which is \$3,372.49 under budget. Despite our losses we are still doing better than budgeted as reflected in our Year-To-Date numbers. 
