From the Pastor's Desk -

OPERATIONS & FINANCE TEAM



Reed Room Floor: Malibu construction provided a quote to remove the existing carpet and install LVT matching the product we are using in the hallway and bathrooms at a cost of \$14,118.00. We decided at the June Council meeting to hold off on this project and see if we can find a willing "sponsor" to pay for this project. **Project "on hold".**

APS Security Cameras: Kath will explain her conversations with APS and the progress that has been made and www.totalconnect2 procedures. Also the cameral on the dumpster needs adjustment, scheduled for Wednesday

November 8th at 9:30 AM.

Security Lighting in the Back of the Thrift Store: It has become apparent with the expansion of the thrift store additional night lighting is necessary for the back area of the thrift store sidewalk, apron, parking lot and dumpster areas. I am looking at possible options to illuminate the dumpster area. Installation will be as soon as I have time to do so. Four of the eight wall lights have been installed. The existing flood light at the end of the Thrift store has been installed. It appears 3 additional wall lights will need to be installed. FPL monthly bill: our demand charge has enhanced to a point where last months bill was over \$600.00. I have been in contact with FLP and they are investigating the reason. We also have an energy audit to be conducted on November 7th.

Additional Work Completed:

Exterior Doors: Three new exterior doors have been installed by Malibu Construction.

Thrift Store Emergency Lighting: Installation in all rooms has commenced.

Pastors' Office: Ceiling and walls patched and painted.. Work completed by Alan Holcomb and Art Horton. (Continued on next page.)

A professional HVAC supply duct and register installed in the ceiling. **Work complete.** Air Techs of Volusia County is also going to install a supply duct and tie into one of the existing ceiling registers in the Reed hallway. **Work Completed.**

Drainage: French Drains were installed for two of the leaders on the sidewalk side of the Reed building, deteriorated sod was removed and new sod placed by Peaceful Palms Landscaping. A quote is forthcoming for an additional French drain for two leaders, Drains will be cleaned out under the sidewalk and new sod will be replaced.

Irrigation System: Is operational but all the sprinkler heads need to be tested and repaired and/or replaced as necessary.

Additional Projects to Discuss Further:

Thrift Store Annex Building: We are awaiting a quote,

Sanctuary Bathrooms/Hallway: Purchase and install four new HC toilets, four sink faucets, replace the pitted handicap hand rails. and paint ceiling and walls. We have left over ceiling and wall paint which will be used in that area. Quote from Premier Renovation was approved by the Council.

Installation of emergency lights on both sides of the bathroom hallway in the Sanctuary will be completed after bathrooms and hallway have been painted. *Art Horton, Operations Chair*

Due to the fabulous job the Store is doing and the income from our rentals we are showing an Operational profit of \$3,924.91 for the month of September and a profit of 24,311.78 year to date. We had estimated a loss of \$240,63.41 for that period but we did not have the rental income from Weight Watchers in our budget forecast nor did we anticipate a profit from the Thrift Store in excess of \$36,000.00 for that period. We have a combined Operational and Capital Improvement loss of 23,237.08 at the end of September. We are fortunate to have a great team of volunteers at the Thrift Store and to have acquired the additional rental income. STWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

Fellow Members and Friends of Port Orange United Church of Christ - as far as I can remember this time of the year in every church I have attended is the time for some type of Stewardship Campaign. This campaign has as its prime purpose the reminder to everyone that we should all be giving financial support to our church and its overall ministry. These campaigns focus attention on urging everyone to pledge what they will be giving financially for the coming year. The results of this campaign are to allow the Church the ability to create a budget for what will be done the following year. A formal Stewardship Campaign may involve presentations, making special pleas from the pulpit, mailings and other reach out activities. Giving usually results from all this effort and the Stewardship Campaign is usually successful. This year, we are going to keep it very simple. Our Church is successful because we have people, members and friends, willing to work and give both their financial and their time support to our church. Our Thrift Store is carrying the majority of our church's financial requirements including the many missions we are able to support due to this success. Because our Church membership has been reduced, our annual giving has been reduced. The reality is that we are not expecting individual giving to increase because we think everyone is already doing what they can. However, we feel that there are other ways of giving that can have a long-term sustaining effect on our Church after many of us are less active and able to give or if the day comes where we pass from this life to the next. Some members are donating a portion the money earned from investments, property sales and other one-time incomes. Some of this coming from retirement accounts where a mandatory Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) must be taken each year per IRS rules. Did you know that any funds donated directly from a retirement account to our Church are also tax free? This means a \$1,000 donation from an IRA or other tax deferred retirement account is a \$1,000 donation. 100%! Otherwise, income taxes are due to the IRS. Where is this money better invested? With the government or with our church? There are many other ways to donate one-time or repeating. Our Church website has big RED BUTTON title "Donation". You can hit it and make a one-time donation or you can tell it to make a monthly repeating donation. Think about all this. What can you do? *Bob Brewster, Moderator*

Please note the Church Office will be closed Thursday and Friday, November 23 & 24. The Gift & Thrift Store will be closed Thursday but will reopen on Friday.


YOUR FOOD BASKET DONATIONS


