Communion on the first Sunday of the month and of Reformation Sunday; the last Sunday in October.

DEACON'S TEAM

The time is fast approaching when our Church needs to start developing the plans that are needed to move forward towards a successful 2019 year. One might think 2019 is far away but it isn't.

Our Church is currently examining the current income and spending for the first nine months of 2018 to see how things might project into 2019. Teams are being asked about their financial priorities. For example, the Deacons are working on the replacement of key components of the sound system that we use for the Easter Sunrise Service. The salt air has made our current system unusable. New components are needed in order to continue our outreach on Easter Sunday.

Starting on October 28, we will begin the process of outlining where we are financially as a Church and what will be needed to reach our goals as a Church.

On November 4, between worship services, there will be an important informational program for people approaching or have reached 70 years old and hold Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA). This program will explain recent changes in tax laws and how you might benefit under these new changes.

Tom Besaw will give a power point presentation during both services to help explain our Church's financial picture.

Sunday, November 18 will find David and Stephanie Whitman leading the worship services. They have been well received in the past and we are looking forward to their leadership.

As in the past couple of years, we have not been using pledge cards but, instead, have been asking members and friends to make their personal goal to God and Port Orange UCC. The use of personal goals has been better received and wider acceptance. These personal goals may be mailed or handed in to the Church Treasurer or put into the Sunday offering plate. We urge everyone to participate by November 18. We will announce the results on the following Sunday, November 25.

Our Church plays an important part in the lives of our members, friends and community. We all appreciate your past financial support and welcome your participation in helping forecast next year's projected church income that will be available towards God's mission for our Church. *Charlie Baskin, Chair of Deacons*

OPERATION'S TEAM

The Operations Team is busy looking at all expenses associated with keeping our church property

maintained and in good working order. Through the generosity of members, we have received gifts to cover the expenses of (1) \$1,000 for putting new low energy/high efficiency lights in the sanctuary (2) \$250 for putting sunscreen film & stained-glass film on the sanctuary windows \$175 for repairing the sanctuary door on the church's east side (4) \$360 for the sanctuary digital camera & accessories. There are other gifted expenses covering many other items such as garbage disposal in the kitchen, faucets in the bathrooms, etc. We recently experienced slippery sidewalks during the voting operation when it rained. This will require pressure washing & cleaning the sidewalks at least two times per year to prevent slipping. In the August newsletter we printed a list of things we identified as possible future expenses over the next couple years. Some of these items can be deferred and done when funds are available. Other items will need to be taken care of when required. Some items will be surprises when they break or when a storm cause damage. All in all, the church grounds and buildings are in very good condition. We thank everyone who has contributed money, labor or both to help make this happen. As we enter the stewardship season, we have requested each church team to submit its budget for 2019. This is a very important step for determining our financial capabilities going forward. A second critical step is how much money our members will set as their personal goal to God and POUCC. Every pledge is very important and every gift is very important. Our church is a "mission orientated church". This means that we require funds to give to others in need. Our Thrift Store is a mission which generates money for our church programs and where we generate material gifts (clothing, furniture, personal items, books, etc.) that help others. Our church two services and fellowship dinners are missions where we provide spiritual and emotional support to all who attend. Our various church missions (not listed here) number in the dozens where we help families, students, other people with money, gifts and food. The list keeps going because of the generosity of POUCC church members and friends. In summary, we are all being asked to give somewhere including to POUCC. We know there are multiple opportunities to give outside our church but this year and next, we are specifically asking that you give more than you have in the past. Our church membership is at a level where we need extraordinary assistance from everyone if we are to continue to care for our facilities and also continue supporting our missions. We have a very valuable asset in our church. We need to protect it and treasure it. Yes, we need new members who can help and yes, they will come when they learn about who we are and what we do. Please do what you can to spread the word. Our church is bright because we are doing all we can do to advance God's word in a spiritually challenged world. MINDER: We are still recycling newspapers, and magazines for which we are reimbursed. The dumpster is located at the rear of the West Property.






