Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ,

Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. This offering will be received **on October 4**th.

OPERATIONS

Dear Members & Friends,

This past month we had a couple air conditioning problems in the old nursery and the main sanctuary. The nursery A/C repair was \$390 and the main sanctuary bill has not been presented. All our air systems are under a maintenance contract so that we may pay lower service fees and get better service when needed. Thank you to everyone that



has made a contribution to our fund raising campaign that maintains our church grounds and facilities. As we enter Fall and then Winter, we will be looking at several overdue projects. One project is how to preserve the wonderful & unique main sanctuary mural. It is showing some small signs of wear and tear that need to be attended to before they grow worse. Another overdue project is the painting of the sanctuary walls. The church grounds are looking great as we keep up with the ever growing weeds, bushes and trees. One project still being researched is how to build a small bridge across the west property retention ditch so that property on the other side can be better utilized when needed. Finally, for those who have asked, the Line of Credit funds applied for from the UCC Cornerstone Fund are now available to us when required. Our plan is to use these funds only when absolutely needed. In closing, if anyone sees anything requiring maintenance attention, please report it to one of our Operations Team members or to Kathy in the church office. *Prayerfully submitted, Bob Brewster Team Chair*
