Our church is going through many changes as we experience seeing our membership grow older leading us to the need to support a more mature aging demographic surrounding us. No longer can we count on young families with children to attend church and stay with us through their growing up years. We are experiencing great changes due to the Covid Pandemic and what people are expecting when they attend church. The spiritual mission of our church requires us to change to support the growing needs of a more mature people who are seeking to rekindle or remain spiritually connected to the Christian Faith. The demographics in our surrounding area are leading us to see more "empty nesters", retirees, people who are displaced from family or friends, or those who have lost close loved ones. There is a real place for POUCC, if we all recognize it and work together to lead our church forward into this new "normal".

MISSION & FELLOWSHIP NOTES

We're starting to gather names for 2022 Committee Members. Since our attendance has been small, we are concerned we may not be able to fill any committees. This low attendance may indicate that our Church's Missions will be nonexistent. We have been unable to provide aid to the Chaplain's Coffee Fund, Boggy Creek, Spruce Creek Elementary School and Sophie's Circle. The Palmetto Teams are short staffed but we have been able to feed with only three active teams. (This creates extra cost for some.) We give to Pregnancy Crisis from Thrift Store donations. Our monthly food donations continue but are smaller. We have started the 2022 Fellowship Dinners and will continue as long as there is interest. Our low attendance has caused much concern about the future of this Church. Understandably the ages of our members is certainly playing a part in those able to commit. Church participation is very important for many reasons, not just for your spiritual renewal but also for your church family to see how you are doing and for you to see how we are doing. There are many reasons that attending church may not be possible. If you are unable to attend on a regular basis please let us know so that we have a better understanding of your situation. If you are no longer able or willing to attend church, please let us know that, too. Let us know by calling the church office. Your cooperation will help us make




