PASTOR'S MESSAGE



From the Pastor's Desk -

A number of years ago, I attended a conference entitled "Care and Kindness." It was offered by Jim Kok who worked at the Crystal Cathedal in Garden Grove, California before it was sold to the Catholic Diocese. I was quite impressed with his two days of presentations on the focus of *Kindness*.

I hadn't heard much from his organization in recent years until the other day. I received a letter with some general information and it made me think more about different facets of kindness. The information I received included some of the following ideas on this topic.

The information began with a question - What is your "Kindness Quotient" There are a number of tests one can take to test our I.Q. There are tests called *Risk Quotient* Tests to check our financial stability, and often magazines offer *Emotional Quotient* Tests to check our emotional state. But I don't believe I've ever seen a test to check what our *Kindness Quotient* might be.

According to Kok here are some things you might find on such a *Kindness Ouotient Test*.

- When was the last time you did something kind for someone in your family e.g. cleared the table, made a cup of coffee, took out the trash without being asked?
- -At your school or workplace which person is most overlooked or avoided? Is there a shy student? How about a grumpy coworker? Is there someone who doesn't fit in or speak the language? Are you kind to this person?
- Kind hearts are quietly kind. They let the car from the side road or the "on ramp" to the highway cut into traffic. They let the young mother with three small kids or the elderly man with only two items move up the checkout line. These are tough things for us to do aren't they?
- Kind hearts pick up the neighbor's trash can that rolled into the street.
- Kind hearts are especially kind at church. They understand that the neediest person they may meet all week is the one standing in the foyer all alone or sitting in the row behind them in worship. (Continued on next page.)

OPERATIONS & FINANCE TEAM REPORT



Reed Room Floor: Malibu construction provided a quote to remove the existing carpet and install LVT matching the product we are using in the hallway and bathrooms at a cost of \$14,118.00. We decided at the June council meeting to hold off on this project and see if we can find a willing "sponsor" to pay for this project. **Project "on hold"**.

Old Kitchen Area in the Church Sanctuary: The existing fluorescent lamps and ballasts were not removed and replaced with LED in this area when we completed the retrofitting of the other areas in the church, Reed and Mix buildings. **Project has been completed**.

APS Security Cameras: APS visited the site and enclosed you will find a proposal to add 3 additional cameras to the system, two in the Thrift Store and one on the end of the Mix building, adjust two of the existing cameras to cover the desired areas, install a long-range lens to cover the Veterans chapel. APS will complete a site visit and functional demonstration of the camera system to all council members. **Work is complete.** .

APS Security System: APS visited the site to advise on adding the Thrift Store to the security system. The Thrift Store and Kitchen will be partitioned (separated from the existing system area) and a separate key pad will be installed in the receiving area of the Thrift store. **Work is complete**.

Security Lighting in the Back of the Thrift Store: It has become apparent with the expansion of the thrift store additional night lighting is necessary for the back area of the thrift store sidewalk, apron, parking lot and dumpster areas. I have ordered additional lighting to be mounted on the wall on the back side (paver area) and a larger wattage flood fixture to replace the existing pole fixture on the end of the thrift store. I am looking at possible options to illuminate the dumpster area. Installation will be as soon as I have time to do so. 4 of the 8 wall lights have been installed. Awaiting cooler weather to remove the existing flood light and replace with the new LED Flood light.

Irrigation System: Tuff Turf has yet to install the new pump and check out the system. We have had sufficient rain thus far. System is operational.

Additional work completed:

Air Techs of Volusia County installed a mini-split HVAC system in the kitchen. Electrical feed was installed in-house, with help from a "friend" for the permit.

Replaced electrical outlets in Jim Reed room.

Replaced non-GFI outlets in Sanctuary bathrooms with GFCI outlets.

Removed old Federal Pacific panel in Reed room and replaced with code compliant 200 amp rated panel. Installed 2 self-luminous exit signs above the exit doors in the sanctuary.

Additional work on the "to do" list.

Three new exterior doors have been ordered and should be installed by Malibu Construction in the next two weeks.

Reed Room HVAC, It appears when the existing outside three phase condenser unit was replaced in 2017, it was not installed with a compatible three phase unit but with a single-phase unit. This has created a hazard, as the conductors (wired) from the service panel to the unit are undersized for the new single-phase unit. I checked the running amperage (18.1 amps) I have purchased 25-amp time delay fuses and will install them in the fused disconnect adjacent to the outside unit. More research is necessary.

Install emergency lights in all the thrift store rooms. Install emergency lights on both sides of the bathroom corridor in the sanctuary.

Purchase 4 new HC toilets and install in the sanctuary bathrooms.

Pastors' office: Patch the ceiling, finish the scuttle hole, paint the ceiling, paint the walls and trim. Obtaining quote.

Obtain quote to repair the ceiling, paint the sanctuary ceilings, hallway and bathrooms. Utilize the same color palate as we did in the Reed bathrooms? We have left over ceiling and blue wall paint.

Air Techs of Volusia County are going to remove the "handyman" ductwork in the Pastors office and install a professional HVAC supply duct and register in the ceiling.

Air Techs of Volusia County are also going to install a supply duct and tie into one of the existing ceiling registers in the Reed hallway. The existing supply registers were fed off the old kitchen system. This will provide A/C in the hallway so that the Mountain of Light may use the hallway for the children's projects.

Yes, it's been a busy summer at the church for sure. Until next time, God bless.

As of August 31st we have spent over \$50,436.05 on improvements to our property which includes installing the fence around the A/C unit, installing pavers behind the Thrift Store, improving outside security lighting, refurbishing the Jim Reed bathrooms and hallway, installing a mini-split A/C unit in the kitchen, expand and upgrade our security system to include the Thrift Store, replace our irrigation pump and wet ends and made a deposit payment to resod and add two French Drains to the lawn area outside the Church Office. We now have a combined loss of \$24,959.18 as of August 31st and hope to be able to continue doing improvements to our property. We are thankful for the income from our wonderful Thrift Store and from our rentals. Our thanks go out to our amazing volunteers and to all who support our Church. 
