The kids sang quite well, and we all had a good time together as we worked on two songs for starters.

Our SENIOR HIGH/YOUNG ADULT CLASS is off to a good start with Carol Strickland as teacher. Most of the class are also members of our Senior Choir, and I thought I was going to have to step down from the choir loft to grab them by the ears to tear them away from deep discussion in order to rehearse with the choir!

Although scheduling is still tighter than it should be for optimum use of our Sunday School Hour -- which in reality turns out to be about 15 minutes -- there is enough interest to make it somehow work out. Space is a factor as well, but the two classes which meet in the Sanctuary do not appear to be hindered by that. Pray that we will soon be able to come up with the best solution to accommodate all our needs.

The Council unanimously approved the bid from NATECO to install the new audio system and video projection in our sanctuary. The Council approved both bids and with enough extra funds, we believe, to cover the costs of the video monitor and sound booth materials needed as well. The costs will be covered by a portion of the last disbursal of funds from the Henderson Estate-to be received within the next month. Upon signing of the contract and deposit received, the equipment will be ordered. No installation date has been set, but we'll keep you posted on this exciting project.

# THE GIFT & THRIFT STORE

Barb Pountain here, from Port Orange United Church of Christ Thrift and Gift Store. I hope you will find the following info helpful, educational and interesting. I refer to our shop as the <u>Thrift & Gift Store</u> as I feel this is a more accurate term to describe us and is more marketable under that title. This is our 14<sup>th</sup> year of operation, located in the classroom building adjacent to the Church.

Originally we occupied 1 class room (11 x 16) and over the years have expanded to four rooms for a total of 700 square feet. Three rooms serve as display area and one room for receiving, sorting, steaming, preparing and storage. We have a couple of rolling clothing racks, for better quality items, and a rolling clearance cart that we put outside during store hours. We do specialize in costume jewelry, vintage items and collectables, however 70% of the store is clothing and accessories for adults and children. Toys and items for men (tools, fishing equipment, etc.) are available and in big demand.

We do not sell x-rated books, tapes, videos, guns, ammunition, bathing suits, used underwear or broken or dangerous items. Because of space considerations, we do not sell larger furniture items. We also try to stay away from computer equipment and larger televisions because they just do not sell well.

There are several thrift shops within 4-5 miles from us and they are located on Ridgewood Avenue, US 1, a main highway. We are somewhat off the beaten track thus advertising is important. I have been fortunate to find free "PSA" with the Penny Saver.

Annual Income Average 2001-2012 = \$24,839.00

We are all volunteers—including little ole me as manager, leader, boss, committee chair or whatever title is assigned this week. Most of our supplies (trash bags, price stickers, etc) are donated by the store volunteers. New shelf units were donated and assembled by Ric Pountain. Electricity costs are included in the total electric bill to the church. All proceeds from the store are deposited to the general fund of the Church.



**HELP US HELP KEEP HELPING OTHERS:** Fall is here and it's a great time to clean out you closets, drawers, garages and crawl spaces. The Thrift Store needs your donations of clothing, jewelry, household items, books and puzzles. Bag it up and bring it in. You not only help others, but you help the Church!

We first came to this area in 1973 when our oldest son married a local girl. He was down here going to college. Since that time, Port Orange has been first a place to come and visit family and after we retired in 1986, we were "snowbirds" for several years. Before we retired, we had noticed that a United Church of Christ was meeting at the Port Orange Community Center which was near the mobile home we had bought in Tanglewood. The first spring that we went "back up north", I received a call from Dr. Claus, the pastor, who informed me that I was the leader of the Women's Fellowship! We now have two great grandchildren locally, they are 15 and 13 and we get to go to all of their school functions, etc. But the greatest thing for us is our POUCC family that we cherish. We have seen many changes, but somehow the "spirit" of the members of this church is what attracts new members to this Church to this day!! 
