I find it difficult to realize that September is once again upon us! For me, September has always been a time of anticipation and new starts. As a child it represents the excitement of preparing to go back to school; new cloths, new shoes, new pencils and paper, a new box of crayons. It was a time of going for class registration, with mom at my side meeting my new teacher for the year. Usually that was pretty exciting as well, that is until I found out who my 2^{nd} grade teacher was for that year. It was Mrs. DeWeese, the

meanest teacher in our school. I recall the polite introductions and the horror of how badly this year was going to be. Oh yes, it didn't help any that Mrs. DeWeese looked exactly like the Wicked Witch of the West in the movie, "Wizard of Oz." Then, at one point Mrs. DeWeese asked me if I had any questions. With all my courage I announced that I hoped that she wasn't going to pull on my ears like I had seen her do for the previous two years on the playground. My mother was horrified at my declaration and it most certainly caught Mrs. DeWeese off guard. She responded that the only reason she would be pulling on my ³ ears would be if I were to misbehave. I can guarantee you that I was the most perfect child in conduct that class year.

I share this bit of obscure history, because even though I had seen Mrs. DeWeese on the playground going up to little boys and shaking them by their ears for no apparent reason, she became my most favorite teacher in my grade school experience. There was a true concern about her students that always took her the extra mile in how she would work in helping her students learn. Some of us were slow learners and she took it upon herself to hold a summer session for those of us who needed that extra push, at no charge to the parents and with no pay from the school district.

When I think about the influences that each one of us has on others, especially children, Mrs. DeWeese will always be at the head of my list for positive motivation and concern for others. This past Sunday, I was struck once again about how important we are to one another here at Port Orange UCC, as Colten Pack presented awards to various people in our congregation for going the extra mile in helping him as he works toward his Eagle Scout status.

I wish to thank everyone who has given so generously these past few months to help finance special needs for Spruce Creek Elementary, and again for the Sept/Oct missions focus of raising money for the 16 or so High School youth who are homeless and without parents to help guide them. Even though most of the recipients of these finances will never know where their help has come from, we can take pride in knowing that we are helping as a positive influence in the lives of these young people. Encouragement, support, mentorship come in so many differing ways, and in so many differing settings. Jesus said, "Let the little children come unto me." Remember, it is you, me, Port Orange UCC that is the "me" in that invitation. We are a family of faith that supports and encourages one another, and at times we go beyond the expected. As we come back from summer break, I wonder what new and exciting things will be happening with us as we move into this new season!


