Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ,

Here we are, ready to get back into full church mode. The choir will begin rehearsing, monthly fellowship dinners will begin and the northern vacationers are coming back. It is great to see all the rested and smiling faces returning home.

During the past few weeks, I've been seeing too many societal issues which are requiring many prayers and continued help from our mission team.

I attended a sub-committee meeting of our Port Orange/South Daytona
Chamber of Commerce. This meeting brought together administrators and teachers from Volusia County to discuss many issues with area pastors and church leaders.
The school officials thanked all of the religious attendees for their continued help, especially helping with the homeless and unaccompanied youth in all levels of our public school system. Our congregation was thanked not only for the funds we continue to provide but also for all our Thrift Store continues to provide for these youth.

At first blush it all sounded good; being thanked, being lifted up, being asked to continue our mission work to these homeless youth. And then it hit me. Yes we can continue to help serve our community as these issues continue to grow but how we can also try to find a way to slow down (and prayerfully stop) these societal problems? How do we get to the root of the problem?

I firmly believe our society has been going backward due to the elimination of God in so many areas of today's society. Somehow we have allowed a very few to exclude God in our everyday lives. We have accepted flimsy excuses not to attend the worship of God, have found mindless ways to fill our time and we find ourselves not giving any effort to tell others about our love for Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior.

How do we begin turning the tables on those who suppress and oppose God in any form? What has happened during the last 50 years or so? How do so many people say they are Christians but never read the Bible, don't pray on a regular basis (unless they need something for themselves) or attend worship? We've lost at least one if not two generations of people finding God in their lives.

These are the same people searching to fill 'the hole' in their lives. For some reason they refuse to look for God as the answer. They try making themselves look good (physically and socially), dedicate themselves into making megabucks and living the good-life, trying different substances (legal and otherwise) to find their inner-selves or finding their entire world revolves around no body but themselves.

The inner searching can be easily solved by allowing God into their lives. Once a person realizes they have a spiritual side within their physical self and there is a much greater power than they themselves, then they can begin to find the peace of God from within. (Continued on next page)

## 2019 UCC FLORIDA CONFEREANCE ANNUAL GATHERING

The UCC in Florida comes together in Orlando Oct. 10-12th for the 2019 Annual Gathering at the Wyndham Orlando Resort International Drive, as staff, lay people, musicians, clergy and guests gather for fellowship and to worship, discern, deliberate, learn and serve together. We need two adults and one youth to represent our congregation and vote. See Joe Thompson if interested in attending.

#### OPERATIONS TEAM



The Charlie Mix Building that houses our Thrift Store and Classrooms has a **NEW ROOF** and **NEW GUTTERS!** It looks beautiful! Plus, we do not have to worry about the next big wind or storm blowing the shingles off where we have to fight the crowds for either repairs or a new roof. The gutters were all installed with high strength aluminum gutter guards which will prevent leaf and debris from collecting in them causing other problems in heavy rains. Also, through the extreme generosity of two POUCC Members, who wish to remain anonymous, we have been given a \$5,000 matching funds challenge to be exclusively used to maintain the church buildings and property. The challenge is that up to \$5,000 will be donated in a matching dollar for dollar campaign that officially began with the church council approval on 8/19/2019 running through December 31, 2019. Any donation made to this fund of any size will be matched equally dollar for dollar. The goal is to raise \$5,000 in matching funds for a total of \$10,000 by year end. We are already started with an anonymous \$500.00 donation to be applied toward the new gutters. When matched we already have a total \$1,000 toward our overall goal. As exciting as this news is to our church, we have also learned that we will be seeing several donations of time and labor for sprucing up our church property. This effort will focus on the church front, the

Prayer Garden and on the area near the Veteran's Chapel bordering Taylor Road. Anyone driving by our church will be able to see this work as it progresses and of course the image we want to convey with this work is that "we are alive and growing" both physically and spiritually. God is certainly working through many hands to keep our church & grounds looking beautiful The results that this work will carry to all that see and who want to believe is "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." 
