The peace of Jesus Christ be with you,



But, we rebounded at the end of last week and with a good week we could hit \$22,000 year to date. If you see a volunteer when you're out and about thank them for the job they do. OPERATIONS TEAM



There is little to report this month but that is good. Lower usage of the church facilities has resulted in lower wear & tear and lower expense. The A/C thermostat controls we added earlier this year are managing that expense very well throughout the church buildings. For those who attended the Church Meeting on August 16th, you heard more information about how we have reviewed all church expenses for more efficiencies and will continue to watch for addition areas where we can improve upon costs. As a rule of thumb, without any staff expenses, it takes about \$6,500-\$7,000 to operate our church every month. This expense will be incurred whether we use the church or not. During the

most recent shutdown when we suspended church services, we saw that this number is what can be expected. Some months are higher because a quarterly or semi-annual payment is due that month but on average it is \$6,500-\$7,000. We are looking at ways we can rent portions of the church, such as the Jim Reed Room, without increasing our expenses. Further, we are looking at opportunities where we might be able to share our church with another compatible religious group where expenses could be shared and where the usages would not conflict with each other. The Thrift Store portion of our church is doing all it can to help and we cannot call upon it to do more. Bob Gaither and his stellar team of volunteers are doing a remarkable job at maximizing both the income and mission opportunities each day it is open. The Veteran's Chapel and West Property are now much more usable since clearing it a few months ago. The addition of a foot bridge across our storm ditch will add to this usability. It may be possible to rent this area on a single use basis to various groups during the year with any income having very little expense offset. Now that we are no longer a voter polling location for elections, we have lost that income and the opportunity for associate bake sales but there may be other opportunities to replace them. Certainly the bake sale was a wonderful chance to highlight our church's baking skills and this could happen again if we find a way to piggy back it on to some event. Creative ideas are always welcome in any of the above. If you have a thought that could lead to a greater church facility use and income without creating a major expense offset, please let us know. If you hear about any group seeking a facility where that group's usage would not conflict with our usage, please let us know. The results of the COVID-19 Pandemic will be with us for a very long time. We have already adjusted for this and now we are on the very positive path to grow our church. People need us and we need them. Remember, Mark 10:27... "Jesus looked at them and said, "With man it is impossible, but not with God. For all things are possible with God."


